\$23.4B In annual funding to support implementation of the Tax Cuts & Jobs Act of 2017, support U.S. courts, and boost economic opportunity

PROMOTING GOOD GOVERNMENT AND PROTECTING THE TAXPAYER

- Provides \$11.43B for the IRS, an increase of \$195.6M above FY17 directed improve taxpayer services
 - Includes \$320M to help the IRS implement the Tax Cuts & Jobs Act of 2017, including hiring, and upgrading schedules, forms, and systems to reflect the new code
 - Targets an additional \$350M to support IRS's customer service
 - Preserves safeguards, funding prohibitions, and oversight of taxpayer dollars at IRS that have been carried in prior years to continue streamlining the IRS and protect against misuse of tax dollars
- Provides \$380M for the Election Assistance Commission to improve election equipment and combat outside interference in U.S. elections
- Provides targeted increases within the General Services Administration for courthouses and land ports of entry across the country as requested by the President, and to make **upgrades and improvements to IT systems government-wide to prevent cybercrimes, terrorism, and intrusion**
- Maintains policy provisions that support the sanctity of life, including prohibiting DC's federal and local funds from being used for abortion, and prohibiting the use of funds to cover abortion in the Federal Employee Health Benefits program

SUPPORTING AMERICAN BUSINESSES

- Promotes opportunities for American small businesses to get off the ground, grow, and prosper by providing \$700.8M for the Small Business Administration, including full funding to support \$29B in 7(a) and \$7.5B in 503 small business loans, as well as \$12.3M to support veterans programs
- Provides \$1.65B for the Securities and Exchange Commission, directing funding to the economics division and to make IT and cybersecurity investments to prevent cybercrime and intrusion
 - Improves transparency, accountability, and fairness, and stops overly burdensome regulations by requiring OMB to report on the cost and regulatory burdens of the Dodd-Frank Act, and prohibiting the agency from requiring the disclosure of political contributions in SEC filings
- Supports the Federal Communications Commission by providing \$322M for salaries and expenses
 - Provides \$600M for FY18 and \$400M for FY19 for payments to television and radio broadcasters for loss of spectrum related to the 2012 Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act.
 - Supports programs created in the new FCC reauthorization, the RAY BAUM Act of 2018

ENFORCING LAWS AND PROTECTING AMERICA'S JUDICIAL SYSTEM

- **Prioritizes funding to fight the opioid epidemi**c by providing **\$415.5M** for the Office of National Drug Control Policy **\$27.3M** above FY17 including **\$280M** for the High-Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas program and **\$117.1M** for other federal drug control programs
- Provides \$7.1B for the federal courts, an increase of \$183.8M above FY17, to support all federal court activities, including the supervision of offenders, court security, and the efficient processing of federal cases
