## FY 2018 Omnibus TRANSPORTATION, HUD

\$70.3B In net discretionary funding, \$12.65B above FY17, with this increase targeted to critical investments in infrastructure to boost economic growth

## INVESTING IN TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE

Invests a total of \$86.2B in total budgetary resources for our nation's transportation infrastructure, including \$27.3B in discretionary appropriations, an increase of \$8.8B above FY17

- Boosts total funding for roads and bridges by \$3.5B above FY17, providing \$45B from the Highway Trust Fund to be spent on the Federal-aid Highways Program (mirroring the FAST Act)
- Includes \$18B in total budgetary resources for the Federal Aviation Administration, \$1.6B above FY17, to help ease future congestion and reduce delays for travelers
  - Fully funds air traffic control personnel and invests \$1.3B in NextGen to modernize the air traffic control system
  - Provides \$165M for the Contract Tower program
- Makes \$3B in investments in rail infrastructure and safety programs, including:
  - Providing **\$1.9B** for Amtrak
  - Addressing critical rail investments needed to sustain current rail services across the nation by providing \$250M for Federal-State Partnership for State of Good Repair Grants
  - Prioritizing rail safety by funding rail safety and search programs at \$287M, Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvement grants at \$593M, including positive train control installation grants at \$250M
- Provides \$13.5B in budgetary resources for the Federal Transit Administration, \$1B above FY17. This total targets funding to help communities build, maintain, and ensure the safety of mass transit systems
- Includes \$980M for the Maritime Administration, \$457M above FY17, of which \$300M is directed to a new national security multi-mission vessel and full funding is provided for the Maritime Security Program
- Targets funding increases toward various safety programs, including +\$36M for NHTSA, +\$201M for the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, and +\$8M for PHMSA
- Provides \$1.5B in funding for TIGER grants to help states and communities address their most critical transportation projects. At least 30% of these funds must go to rural communities

## MAINTAINING HOUSING FOR AMERICANS IN NEED

Provides a net discretionary total of \$42.7B for the Department of Housing and Urban Development

- Contains \$7.7B for Community Planning and Development Programs, including \$3.3B for Community **Development Block Grants** to provide infrastructure dollars to states and local communities to address needs and bolster economic growth
- Supports Section 8 and Public and Native American Housing by providing \$30.3B, \$2.8B above FY17, to continue assistance to all families and individuals currently served and to add thousands of new units for veterans and persons with disabilities
- Provides \$12.5B for other housing programs, \$952M above FY17, which is needed to continue existing assistance to all currently served, including elderly and disabled families and veterans
