6	(a) REGISTRATION.—Section 4(b) of the Lobbying
7	Disclosure Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C. 1603(b)) is amended—
8	(1) in paragraph (5), by striking "and" at the
9	end;
10	(2) in paragraph (6) , by striking the period at
11	the end and inserting "; and"; and
12	(3) by inserting after paragraph (6) the fol-
13	lowing:
14	"(7) for any listed lobbyist who was convicted
15	in a Federal or State court of an offense involving
16	bribery, extortion, embezzlement, an illegal kickback,
17	tax evasion, fraud, a conflict of interest, making a
18	false statement, perjury, or money laundering, the
19	date of the conviction and a description of the of-
20	fense.".
21	(b) Quarterly Reports.—Section 5(b) of the Lob-
22	bying Disclosure Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C. 1604(b)) is

24	(1) in paragraph (4), by striking "and" at the

2	the end and inserting "; and"; and
3	(3) by adding at the end the following:
4	"(6) for any listed lobbyist who was convicted
5	in a Federal or State court of an offense involving
6	bribery, extortion, embezzlement, an illegal kickback,
7	tax evasion, fraud, a conflict of interest, making a
8	false statement, perjury, or money laundering, the
9	date of the conviction and a description of the of-
10	fense.".
