A BILL

To eliminate the 2013 statutory pay adjustment for Federal employees.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ELIMINATION OF 2013 PAY ADJUSTMENT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 147 of the Continuing
5 Appropriations Act, 2011 (Public Law 111–242; 5 U.S.C.
6 5303 note), as amended by section 114(a) of the Con-

1 tinuing Appropriations Resolution, 2013 (Public Law
2 112–175; 126 Stat. 1316), is amended—

3 (1) in subsection (b)(1), by striking the matter
4 after “ending on” and before “shall be made” and
5 inserting “December 31, 2013,”; and

6 (2) in subsection (c), by striking the matter
7 after “ending on” and before “no senior executive”
8 and inserting “December 31, 2013,”.

9 (b) ELIMINATION OF DELAYED ADJUSTMENT.—Sec-
10 tion 114(b) of the Continuing Appropriations Resolution,
11 2013 is repealed.

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
