



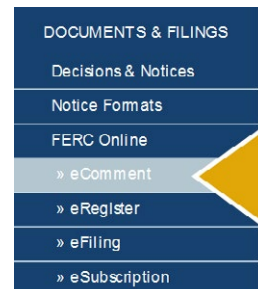
FERC's How-to Guide on Online Public Comment

eComment eFiling eRegister eSubscription

FERC welcomes public comment on all matters under consideration, including the **licensing and re-licensing of hydroelectric facilities, pre-filing activities for planned natural gas projects, and applications to build natural gas pipelines, liquefied natural gas facilities or related facilities.**



- ✓ Go to www.FERC.gov
- ✓ Put your cursor on the “Documents and Filings” section on the blue ribbon on the top half of the page.
- ✓ From the drop-down menu, you can select eComment, eRegister, eFiling or eSubscription.



1 eComment: Limited to Individuals

- ✓ The form is limited to 6,000 characters and does not allow attachments.
- ✓ Your session times out after 35 minutes of inactivity. FERC recommends that you create your comments in a Word or text document, and then paste them into the eComment submission form.
- ✓ eComment is limited to select dockets or matters under consideration and noted above.
- ✓ You will not need to register but you must supply an active email address.

2 eFiling: Company • Agency • Organization • Association • Intervenor

- ✓ Allows you to submit comments that exceed 6,000 characters, as well as non-text materials, such as exhibits or photos and other file attachments.
- ✓ You must first create a **user name** and **password** by registering as a **FERC Online User** through the **eRegistration** system.
- ✓ eRegistering gives you access to the **eSubscription** system. eSubscription helps you track matters before the Commission, and you can subscribe to a specific docket number for each proceeding.
- ✓ eSubscription will notify you via email about submittals and issuances in the proceeding, and you can retrieve public documents through the links in the emails. You may subscribe to multiple proceedings using the same eRegistered account.
