# Services



### Technical Services

Properly functioning radios are critical to the safety of public safety professionals and the public they serve. A radio that has drifted out of alignment or has been improperly programmed can cause big issues. Let our ace technicians diagnose your problems! Agencies can bring up to three (3) Motorola radios and/or their programming template for review. We'll also discuss the Advanced System Key (ASK) program and new equipment soon to be allowed on the statewide public safety communications system.



### Communications Training & Planning

Need a quick refresher on radio communications or additional training offered? Perhaps you want to get hands-on assistance with your County Communications Plan or Site Trunking Plan. Stop in to chat with Mike, Tyler and Andi, IPSC's TOP (Training Outreach & Planning) team!



### Data Sharing (CAD/RMS)

Did you know that the state provides a standards-based, shared data system accessible to all of Indiana's public safety agencies? Hundreds of agencies across the state take advantage of the statewide CAD/Mobile/ RMS system. Learn how data sharing works, and how it can save lives and money. Members of the IPSC MADDEN team will provide a demo of the system and will also be available to troubleshoot/answer questions from current users.



### FirstNet

For years, first responders have been laying the foundation for a dedicated nationwide public safety broadband communications network. Now that all 50 states have opted in to FirstNet, what's next?
