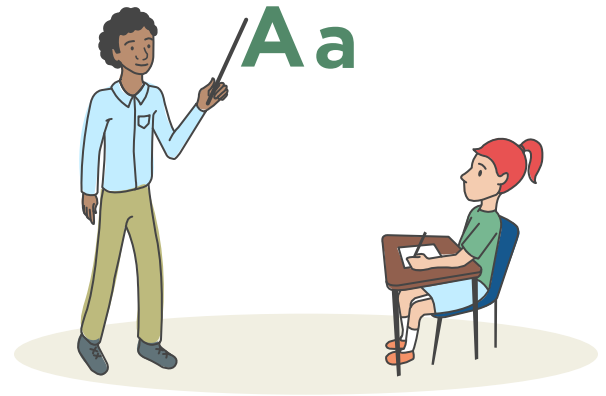

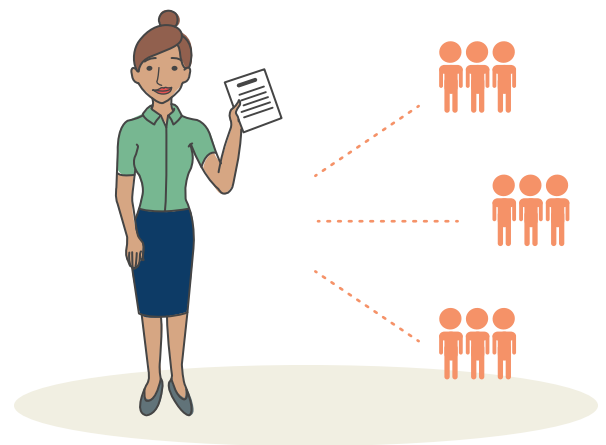
TEACHERS CAN...

- Find a supplemental reading program that has been shown to be effective with students similar to theirs



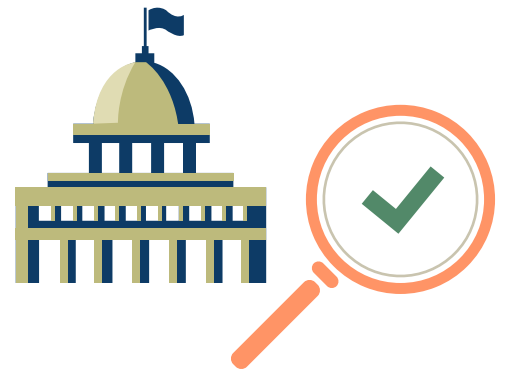
ADMINISTRATORS CAN...
