Unanimous Consent Agreement

Ordered, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the following nominations: Shelly Deckert Dick, of Louisiana, to be United States District Judge for the Middle District of Louisiana, and Nelson Stephen Roman, of New York, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of New York.

Ordered further, That there be 30 minutes for debate equally divided in the usual form; that upon the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to vote without intervening action or debate on the nominations in the order listed; the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate; that no further motions be in order to the nominations; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.


