Ordered, That at 2 p.m., on Thursday, August 1, 2013, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Samantha Power, of Massachusetts, to be the Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations, with the rank and status of Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, and the Representative of the United States of America in the Security Council of the United Nations.

Ordered further, That there be 2 hours for debate equally divided between the proponents and opponents; that following the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination; the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate; that no further motions be in order; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session. (*July 29, 31, 2013.*)

Raymond T. Chen (Cal. No. 96)

Ordered, That at 11 a.m., on Thursday, August 1, 2013, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Raymond T. Chen, of Maryland, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Federal Circuit.

Ordered further, That there be 60 minutes for debate equally divided in the usual form; that following the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination; the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate; that no further motions be in order; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.
