## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO CALL A CONVENTION TO PROPOSE AN AMENDMENT TO PROTECT THE LIVES OF THE UNBORN.

WHEREAS, millions of abortions are alleged to have been performed in the United States since the decision on abortions by the United States 2 Supreme Court on January 22, 1973; and 3

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has not proposed to date 4 a "human-life amendment" to the Constitution of the United States.

#### NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 129th General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the Senate concurring herein, applies to the Congress of the United States to call a convention to propose an amendment to the Constitution that would protect the lives of all human beings including unborn children at every stage of their biological development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this application shall constitute a continuing application for such a convention pursuant to Article V of the Constitution of the United States until such time as the Legislatures of two-thirds of the States shall have made like applications and such convention shall have been called by the Congress of the United States.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this concurrent resolution be 18 presented to the President of the Senate of the United States, the 19 Secretary of the Senate of the United States, the Speaker of the House of 20 the House of Representatives of the United States, the Clerk of the House 21 of Representatives of the United States, and to each member of the Congress 22 from Delaware attesting the adoption of this concurrent resolution by the 23 129th General Assembly of the State of Delaware. 24
