6	fiscal year 2019, and for other purposes, namely:

8	DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
9	AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMS
10	PROCESSING, RESEARCH AND MARKETING
11	OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY
12	For an additional amount for the "Office of the Sec-
13	retary", \$1,105,442,000, which shall remain available
14	until December 31, 2020, for necessary expenses related
15	to losses of crops (including milk), trees, bushes, and
16	vines, as a consequence of Hurricanes Michael or Flor-
17	ence, other hurricanes, typhoons, volcanic activity, or
18	wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018 under such

terms and conditions as determined by the Secretary: Pro-1 2 *vided*, That the Secretary may provide assistance for such 3 losses in the form of block grants to eligible states and 4 territories and such assistance may include compensation 5 to producers, as determined by the Secretary, for past or future crop insurance premiums, forest restoration, and 6 7 poultry and livestock losses: *Provided further*, That of the 8 amounts provided under this heading, tree assistance pay-9 ments may be made under section 1501(e) of the Agricul-10 tural Act of 2014 (7 U.S.C. 9081(e)) to eligible orchardists or nursery tree growers (as defined in such section) 11 of pecan trees with a tree mortality rate that exceeds 7.5 12 13 percent (adjusted for normal mortality) and is less than 15 percent (adjusted for normal mortality), to be available 14 15 until expended, for losses incurred during the period beginning January 1, 2018, and ending December 31, 2018: 16 *Provided further*, That in the case of producers impacted 17 by volcanic activity that resulted in the loss of crop land, 18 19 or access to crop land, the Secretary shall consider all 20 measures available, as appropriate, to bring replacement 21 land into production: *Provided further*, That the total 22 amount of payments received under this heading and ap-23 plicable policies of crop insurance under the Federal Crop 24 Insurance Act (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.) or the Noninsured 25 Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) under section

196 of the Federal Agriculture Improvement and Reform 1 Act of 1996 (7 U.S.C. 7333) shall not exceed 90 percent 2 3 of the loss as determined by the Secretary: Provided further, That the total amount of payments received under 4 5 this heading for producers who did not obtain a policy or plan of insurance for an insurable commodity for the ap-6 7 plicable crop year under the Federal Crop Insurance Act 8 (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.) for the crop incurring the losses 9 or did not file the required paperwork and pay the service 10 fee by the applicable State filing deadline for a noninsurable commodity for the applicable crop year under NAP 11 12 for the crop incurring the losses shall not exceed 70 per-13 cent of the loss as determined by the Secretary: *Provided further*, That producers receiving payments under this 14 15 heading, as determined by the Secretary, shall be required to purchase crop insurance where crop insurance is avail-16 17 able for the next two available crop years, excluding tree 18 insurance policies, and producers receiving payments 19 under this heading shall be required to purchase coverage 20 under NAP where crop insurance is not available in the 21 next two available crop years, as determined by the Sec-22 retary: Provided further, That, not later than 120 days 23 after the end of fiscal year 2019, the Secretary shall sub-24 mit a report to the Congress specifying the type, amount, 25 and method of such assistance by state and territory: Pro-

vided further, That such amount is designated by the Con gress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to
 section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and
 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

7 For an additional amount for the "Emergency Forest 8 Restoration Program", for necessary expenses related to 9 the consequences of Hurricanes Michael and Florence and 10 wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018, and other natural disasters, \$480,000,000, to remain available until ex-11 12 pended: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the 13 Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and 14 15 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

17 WATERSHED AND FLOOD PREVENTION OPERATIONS

18 For an additional amount for "Watershed and Flood Prevention Operations", for necessary expenses for the 19 20Emergency Watershed Protection Program related to the 21 consequences of Hurricanes Michael and Florence and 22 wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018, and other nat-23 ural disasters, \$125,000,000, to remain available until ex-24 pended: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the 25 Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and
 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

4 RURAL COMMUNITY FACILITIES PROGRAM ACCOUNT

5 For an additional amount for the cost of grants for rural community facilities programs as authorized by sec-6 7 tion 306 and described in section 381E(d)(1) of the Con-8 solidated Farm and Rural Development Act, for necessary 9 expenses related to the consequences of Hurricanes Mi-10 chael and Florence and wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018, and other natural disasters, \$150,000,000, to 11 remain available until expended: Provided, That sections 12 381E-H and 381N of the Consolidated Farm and Rural 13 Development Act are not applicable to the funds made 14 15 available under this heading: *Provided further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an 16 17 emergency requirement pursuant section to 18 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 19 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

20 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

SEC. 101. In addition to other amounts made available by section 309 of Public Law 115-72, there is hereby
appropriated \$600,000,000 for the Secretary of Agriculture to provide a grant to the Commonwealth of Puerto
Rico for disaster nutrition assistance in response to Presi-

dentially declared major disasters and emergencies: Pro-1 vided, That the funds made available to the Common-2 wealth of Puerto Rico under this section shall remain 3 4 available for obligation by the Commonwealth until Sep-5 tember 30, 2020, and shall be in addition to funds otherwise made available: *Provided further*, That such amount 6 7 is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency 8 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the 9 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. 10

11 SEC. 102. In addition to amounts otherwise made 12 available, out of the funds made available under section 18 of Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, \$10,200,000 shall 13 be available for the Secretary to provide a grant to the 14 15 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands for disaster nutrition assistance in response to the Presidentially 16 declared major disasters and emergencies: *Provided*, That 17 funds made available to the Commonwealth of the North-18 19 ern Mariana Islands under this section shall remain avail-20able for obligation by the Commonwealth until September 21 30, 2020: Provided further, That such amount is des-22 ignated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-23 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-24 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

1 SEC. 103. For purposes of administering title I of 2 subdivision 1 of division B of the Bipartisan Budget Act 3 of 2018 (Public Law 115–123), losses to agricultural pro-4 ducers resulting from hurricanes shall also include losses 5 of peach and blueberry crops in calendar year 2017 due to extreme cold: *Provided*, That the amounts provided by 6 7 this section are designated by the Congress as being for 8 an emergency requirement pursuant to section 9 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, That 10 amounts repurposed under this heading that were pre-11 12 viously designated by the Congress as an emergency re-13 quirement pursuant to the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 are designated by the 14 15 Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-16 17 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

18 SEC. 104. (a)(1) Except as provided in paragraph 19 (2), a person or legal entity is not eligible to receive a 20 payment under the Market Facilitation Program estab-21 lished pursuant to the Commodity Credit Corporation 22 Charter Act (15 U.S.C. 714 et seq.) if the average ad-23 justed gross income of such person or legal entity is great-24 er than \$900,000. (2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to a person or legal
 entity if at least 75 percent of the adjusted gross income
 of such person or legal entity is derived from farming,
 ranching, or forestry related activities.

5 (b) A person or legal entity may not receive a pay6 ment under the Market Facilitation Program described in
7 subsection (a)(1), directly or indirectly, of more than
8 \$125,000.

9 (c) In this section, the term "average adjusted gross 10 income" has the meaning given the term defined in section 11 760.1502 of title 7 Code of Federal Regulations (as in 12 effect July 18, 2018).

(d) The amount provided by this section is designated
by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement
pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

4 For an additional amount for "Procurement, Acquisition and Construction", \$25,000,000, to remain available 5 until September 30, 2021, for improvements to oper-6 7 ational and research weather supercomputing infrastruc-8 ture and satellite ground services used for hurricane inten-9 sity and track prediction; flood prediction, forecasting, and 10 mitigation; and wildfire prediction, detection, and forecasting: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the 11 12 Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant 13 to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, 14 15 That the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration shall submit a spending plan to the Committees on 16 Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the 17 18 Senate within 45 days after the date of enactment of this 19 Act.

For an additional amount for "Fisheries Disaster Assistance" for necessary expenses associated with the mitigation of fishery disasters, \$150,000,000, to remain available until expended: *Provided*, That funds shall be used for mitigating the effects of commercial fishery failures

and fishery resource disasters declared by the Secretary 1 of Commerce, including those declared by the Secretary 2 to be a direct result of Hurricanes Florence and Michael 3 4 and Typhoons Yutu and Mangkhut: Provided further, 5 That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 6 7 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 8 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

7 For an additional amount for "Payment to the Legal 8 Services Corporation" to carry out the purposes of the 9 Legal Services Corporation Act by providing for necessary 10 expenses related to the consequences of Hurricanes Florence, Michael, and Lane, Typhoons Yutu and Mangkhut, 11 12 and calendar year 2018 wildfires, volcanic eruptions, and 13 earthquakes, \$15,000,000: Provided, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-14 15 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: 16 *Provided further*, That none of the funds appropriated in 17 this Act to the Legal Services Corporation shall be ex-18 pended for any purpose prohibited or limited by, or con-19 trary to any of the provisions of, sections 501, 502, 503, 20 21 504, 505, and 506 of Public Law 105–119, and all funds 22 appropriated in this Act to the Legal Services Corporation 23 shall be subject to the same terms and conditions set forth 24 in such sections, except that all references in sections 502 and 503 to 1997 and 1998 shall be deemed to refer in-25

For an additional amount for "Operation and Maintenance, Air Force", \$400,000,000, for necessary expenses related to the consequences of Hurricanes Michael and Florence: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

TITLE IV CORPS OF ENGINEERS—CIVIL DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY INVESTIGATIONS

5 For an additional amount for "Investigations" for necessary expenses related to the completion, or initiation 6 7 and completion, of flood and storm damage reduction, in-8 cluding shore protection, studies which are currently au-9 thorized or which are authorized after the date of enact-10 ment of this Act, to reduce risk from future floods and hurricanes, at full Federal expense, \$35,000,000, to re-11 12 main available until expended, in States and insular areas that were impacted by Hurricanes Florence and Michael, 13 Typhoon Mangkhut, Super Typhoon Yutu, and Tropical 14 15 Storm Gita: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pur-16 17 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget 18 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided fur-19 ther, That the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil 20 Works shall provide a monthly report directly to the Com-21 mittees on Appropriations of the House and the Senate 22 detailing the allocation and obligation of these funds, in-23 cluding new studies selected to be initiated using funds 24 provided under this heading, beginning not later than 60 25 days after the enactment of this Act.

CONSTRUCTION

2 For an additional amount for "Construction" for necessary expenses, \$715,000,000, to remain available until 3 4 expended, to construct flood and storm damage reduction, 5 including shore protection, projects which are currently authorized or which are authorized after the date of enact-6 7 ment of this Act, and flood and storm damage reduction, 8 including shore protection, projects which have signed 9 Chief's Reports as of the date of enactment of this Act or which are studied using funds provided under the head-10 ing "Investigations" if the Secretary determines such 11 12 projects to be technically feasible, economically justified, 13 and environmentally acceptable, in States and insular areas that were impacted by Hurricanes Florence and Mi-14 15 chael, Typhoon Mangkhut, Super Typhoon Yutu, and Tropical Storm Gita: *Provided*, That projects receiving 16 17 funds provided in Public Law 115–123 shall not be eligible 18 for funding provided under this heading: *Provided further*, 19 That for projects receiving funding under this heading, the provisions of Section 902 of the Water Resources Act of 2021 1986 shall not apply to these funds: *Provided further*, That 22 the completion of ongoing construction projects receiving 23 funds provided under this heading shall be at full Federal 24 expense with respect to such funds: *Provided further*, That using funds provided under this heading, the non-Federal 25

17 For an additional amount for "Electricity Delivery", 18 \$15,500,000, to remain available until expended, for nec-19 essary expenses related to the consequences of Hurricanes 20 Harvey, Irma, and Maria, and Super Typhoon Yutu, in-21 cluding technical assistance related to electric grids: Pro-22 *vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress 23 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-24 tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-25 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, That the Assistant Secretary of Electricity Delivery shall pro vide a monthly report to the Committees on Appropria tions of the House of Representatives and the Senate de tailing the allocation and obligation of these funds, begin ning not later than 60 days after the enactment of this

building and technical assistance, including assistance on 1 2 contracting and procurement processes, to support States, 3 units of general local government, or Indian tribes (and 4 their subrecipients) that receive allocations pursuant to 5 this heading, received disaster recovery allocations under the same heading in Public Law 115–254, or may receive 6 7 similar allocations for disaster recovery in future appro-8 priations Acts: *Provided further*, That of the amounts 9 made available under this heading and under the same heading in Public Law 115–254, up to \$2,500,000 shall 10 be transferred, in aggregate, to "Department of Housing" 11 12 and Urban Development—Program Office Salaries and Expenses—Community Planning and Development" for 13 necessary costs, including information technology costs, of 14 15 administering and overseeing the obligation and expenditure of amounts under this heading: *Provided further*, 16 That the amount specified in the preceding proviso shall 17 be combined with funds appropriated under the same 18 heading and for the same purpose in Public Law 115-19 254 and the aggregate of such amounts shall be available 20 21 for any of the same such purposes specified under this 22 heading or the same heading in Public Law 115–254 with-23 out limitation: *Provided further*, That such amount is des-24 ignated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

3 GENERAL PROVISION—THIS TITLE

4 SEC. 1001. (a) Amounts previously made available 5 for activities authorized under title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et 6 seq.) related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restora-7 8 tion of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization, 9 and mitigation in the most impacted and distressed areas 10 resulting from a major disaster, including funds provided under section 145 of division C of Public Law 114–223, 11 12 section 192 of division C of Public Law 114–223 (as 13 added by section 101(3) of division A of Public Law 114– 254), section 421 of division K of Public Law 115–31, 14 15 and any mitigation funding provided under the heading 16 "Department of Housing and Urban Development—Community Planning and Development—Community Develop-17 18 ment Fund" of Public Law 115–123, that were allocated in response to Hurricane Matthew, may be used inter-19 changeably and without limitation for the same activities 2021 in the most impacted and distressed areas related to Hur-22 ricane Florence. In addition, any funds provided under the 23 heading "Department of Housing and Urban Develop-24 ment—Community Planning and Development—Community Development Fund" in this Act or in division I of 25

Public Law 115–254 that are allocated in response to 1 Hurricane Florence may be used interchangeably and 2 3 without limitation for the same activities in the most im-4 pacted and distressed areas related to Hurricane Matthew. 5 Until HUD publishes the Federal Register Notice implementing this provision, grantees may submit for HUD ap-6 7 proval revised plans for the use of funds related to Hurri-8 cane Matthew that expand the eligible beneficiaries of ex-9 isting programs contained in such previously approved 10 plans to include those impacted by Hurricane Florence. Approval of any such revised plans shall include the execu-11 tion of revised grant terms and conditions as necessary. 12 13 Once the implementing Notice is published, any additional action plan revisions shall follow the requirements con-14 15 tained therein.

16 (b) Amounts made available for administrative costs for activities authorized under title I of the Housing and 17 18 Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et seq.) related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restora-19 20 tion of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization, 21 and mitigation in the most impacted and distressed areas 22 under this Act or any future Act, and amounts previously 23 provided under section 420 of division L of Public Law 24 114–113, section 145 of division C of Public Law 114– 223, section 192 of division C of Public Law 114–223 (as 25

added by section 101(3) of division A of Public Law 114– 1 254), section 421 of division K of Public Law 115–31, 2 and under the heading "Department of Housing and 3 4 Urban Development—Community Planning and Development—Community Development Fund" of division B of 5 Public Law 115–56, Public Law 115–123, and Public 6 7 Law 115–254, shall be available for eligible administrative 8 costs of the grantee related to any disaster relief funding 9 identified in this subsection without regard to the par-10 ticular disaster appropriation from which such funds origi-11 nated.

12 (c) The additional uses pursuant to this section for 13 amounts that were previously designated by the Congress, respectively, as an emergency requirement or as being for 14 15 disaster relief pursuant to the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act are designated by the Con-16 17 gress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to 18 section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or as being for 19 disaster relief pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D) of the 20 21 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 22 1985.

TITLE XI

GENERAL PROVISION—THIS ACT

3 SEC. 1101. Each amount designated in this Act by 4 the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pur-5 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget 6 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 shall be avail-7 able (or rescinded or transferred, if applicable) only if the 8 President subsequently so designates all such amounts 9 and transmits such designations to the Congress.

10 This Act may be cited as the "Supplemental Appro-11 priations Act, 2019".

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
