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## A BILL

To require the President to use authorities under the Defense Production Act of 1950 to require emergency production of medical equipment to address the COVID-19 outbreak.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medical Supply Chain  
5 Emergency Act of 2020”.

6 **SEC. 2. EMERGENCY PRODUCTION OF MEDICAL EQUIP-**  
7 **MENT TO ADDRESS COVID-19 OUTBREAK.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Immediately upon the enactment  
9 of this Act, the President shall—

10 (1) determine under section 101(b) of the De-  
11 fense Production Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. 4511(b))  
12 that—

13 (A) medical equipment described in para-  
14 graph (3)(A) is scarce and a critical material  
15 essential to the national defense; and

16 (B) the requirements of the national de-  
17 fense for such equipment cannot be met without  
18 exercising the authorities provided by the De-  
19 fense Production Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. 4501  
20 et seq.);

21 (2) identify private sector capacity to produce  
22 such equipment; and

23 (3) exercise the authorities provided by the De-  
24 fense Production Act of 1950 to the extent nec-  
25 essary—

1 (A) to require emergency production of—

2 (i) not less than—

3 (I) 500,000,000 N95 respirators;

4 (II) 200,000 medical ventilators;

5 (III) 20,000,000 face shields;

6 (IV) 500,000,000 pairs of med-

7 ical exam gloves; and

8 (V) 20,000,000 surgical gowns;

9 and

10 (ii) such other medical equipment as

11 the President determines to be necessary

12 to address the coronavirus disease 2019

13 (commonly known as “COVID-19”) out-

14 break; and

15 (B) to establish a fair and reasonable price

16 for the sale of medical equipment produced pur-

17 suant to subparagraph (A).

18 (b) COORDINATION.—The President shall coordinate

19 and direct the allocation of medical equipment produced

20 under subsection (a) based on requests from the Gov-

21 ernors of the States and the needs of the States, as deter-

22 mined based on—

23 (1) the number of cases of COVID-19 in a

24 State; and

1           (2) the proportion of the population in a State  
2           with a higher risk of developing a serious illness  
3           from COVID-19.

4           (c) FUNDING.—Amounts available in the Defense  
5           Production Act Fund under section 304 of the Defense  
6           Production Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. 4534) shall be avail-  
7           able to carry out this section.

8           (d) TERMINATION.—

9           (1) IN GENERAL.—This section, and authorities  
10          carried out pursuant to this section, shall terminate  
11          on the date on which the national emergency de-  
12          clared under the National Emergencies Act (50  
13          U.S.C. 1601 et seq.) on March 13, 2020, relating to  
14          the COVID-19 outbreak, terminates.

15          (2) DISPOSITION OF UNUSED MEDICAL EQUIP-  
16          MENT.—Any medical equipment produced pursuant  
17          to subsection (a) using amounts from the Defense  
18          Production Act Fund and unused as of the date de-  
19          scribed in paragraph (1) shall be deposited in the  
20          Strategic National Stockpile.

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
