Rachel has over a decade of experience in public policy in Washington, D.C., where she currently serves as Senior Director of Policy at the Conservative Partnership Institute and Senior Advisor to the Internet Accountability Project.

Beginning in 2006, she served in both the House and Senate in various roles including as legislative director for Senator Rand Paul (R-Ky.). Rachel went on to serve as policy director for the Senate Steering Committee under the successive chairmanships of Senator Pat Toomey (R-Pa.) and Senator Mike Lee (R-Utah), where she advised Committee members on strategy related to floor procedure and policy matters. In the House, she worked as senior legislative assistant to Congressman Donald Manzullo (R-Ill.), and Congressman Ted Poe (R-Texas). She also served as director of policy services for The Heritage Foundation.

In 2013, she was named one of *National Journal's* Most Influential Women in Washington under 35. Her policy analysis and punditry appear widely in print and on television.

Along with CPI's Chairman, Sen. Jim DeMint, is the co-author of *Conservative: Knowing What to Keep*. She is also a Fellow at Defense Priorities, and a senior advisor to the Millennial Debt Commission. Rachel serves on the board of the Council for National Policy Action, and the Advisory Board of The American Conservative.

Rachel earned her undergraduate degree, *summa cum laude*, from Grove City College in 2006, and holds a Masters in Professional Studies from the George Washington University. In addition to her public policy pursuits, she is an accomplished sommelier, diploma candidate in the Wine and Spirits Education Trust, and runs her own small wine consulting firm.
