Todd Myers

Mr. Myers is the Environmental Director at the Washington Policy Center, a public policy think tank in Seattle. His work focuses on using technological innovation to promote environmental stewardship. In addition, he partnered with criminal justice advocates to advocate for two new laws that remove regulatory barriers for formerly incarcerated individuals looking for work.

Currently, he is a member of the Puget Sound Salmon Recovery Council, a state board that prioritizes salmon recovery using science-based metrics.

He previously served as Vice-President of the Northwest Association of Biomedical Research and received their “Distinguished Service Award” in 2018 for his support of bioscience. Myers also served as President of the Prescription Drug Assistance Foundation, a non-profit providing medicines to low-income patients.

From 1997 through 2000, Todd was the Director of Public Relations for the Seattle SuperSonics. Prior to that he served as Director of Public Relations for the Seattle Mariners.

A former computer programmer, Mr. Myers has a bachelor’s degree in Politics from Whitman College and a master’s degree in Russian/International Studies from the Jackson School of International Studies at the University of Washington. He and his wife Maria live in the Cascade Mountains in Washington state with 200,000 honeybees.
