SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1
2 applying to the Congress of the United States to call a convention
3 under Article V of the United States Constitution for the limited
4 purpose of proposing one or more amendments to the constitution to
5 impose fiscal restraints on the federal government, to limit the
6 power and jurisdiction of the federal government, and to limit the
7 terms of office of federal officials and members of Congress.

8 WHEREAS, The drafters of the United States Constitution
9 empowered state legislatures to be guardians of liberty against
10 abuses of power by the federal government; and

11 WHEREAS, The federal government has abused its power by
12 creating a crushing national debt through improper and imprudent
13 spending; and

14 WHEREAS, The federal government has abused its power by
15 invading the legitimate role of the states through the manipulative
16 process of federal mandates that are to a great extent unfunded; and

17 WHEREAS, The federal government has ceased to abide by a
18 proper interpretation of the United States Constitution; and

19 WHEREAS, It is the solemn duty of state legislatures to
20 protect the liberty of the people and of future generations by
21 proposing amendments to the United States Constitution that place
22 clear restraints on federal power; and

23 WHEREAS, Article V of the United States Constitution
24 authorizes the several state legislatures to restrict the power of

1 the federal government through the amendment process; and

2 WHEREAS, Article V of the United States Constitution provides
3 that on application of the legislatures of two-thirds of the
4 several states Congress shall call a convention for the purpose of
5 proposing amendments to the constitution; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That the 85th Texas Legislature apply to Congress
7 to call a convention under Article V of the United States
8 Constitution for the limited purpose of proposing one or more
9 amendments to the constitution to impose fiscal restraints on the
10 federal government, to limit the power and jurisdiction of the
11 federal government, and to limit the terms of office of federal
12 officials and members of Congress; and, be it further

13 RESOLVED, That, unless rescinded by a succeeding
14 legislature, this application by the 85th Texas Legislature
15 constitutes a continuing application in accordance with Article V
16 of the United States Constitution until at least two-thirds of the
17 legislatures of the several states have applied to Congress to call
18 a convention for the limited purpose of proposing one or more
19 amendments to the constitution to impose fiscal restraints on the
20 federal government, to limit the power and jurisdiction of the
21 federal government, and to limit the terms of office of federal
22 officials and members of Congress; and, be it further

23 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
24 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to
25 the speaker of the House of Representatives and the president of the
26 Senate of the Congress of the United States, and to all members of
27 the Texas delegation to Congress with the request that this


1 resolution be officially entered in the Congressional Record as an
2 application to Congress for a convention under Article V of the
3 United States Constitution for the limited purpose of proposing one
4 or more amendments to the constitution to impose fiscal restraints
5 on the federal government, to limit the power and jurisdiction of
6 the federal government, and to limit the terms of office of federal
7 officials and members of Congress; and, be it further

8. RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
9 copies of this resolution to the secretaries of state and to the
10 presiding officers of the legislatures of the several states with
11 the request that they join this state in applying to Congress for a
12 convention under Article V of the United States Constitution for
13 the limited purpose of proposing one or more amendments to the
14 constitution to impose fiscal restraints on the federal government,
15 to limit the power and jurisdiction of the federal government, and
16 to limit the terms of office of federal officials and members of
17 Congress.




