## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### **Constance J. Milstein (Cal. No. 922) (PN1466)**

*Ordered,* That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Republican Leader the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Constance J. Milstein, of New York, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the Republic of Malta.

*Ordered further,* That there be 10 minutes of debate equally divided in the usual form.

*Ordered further,* That upon the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination.

*Ordered further,* That if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate; that no further motions be in order; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions, and the Senate then resume legislative session. (*Jul. 19, 2022.*)

### **Cathy Ann Harris (Cal. No. 716) (PN1599)**

*Ordered,* That cloture having been invoked on nomination of Cathy Ann Harris, of Maryland, to be Chairman of the Merit Systems Protection Board, all post-cloture time be considered expired, and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, or his designee, following consultation with the Republican Leader.
