## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, September 28, 2021, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Karen Erika Donfried, of the District of Columbia, to be an Assistant Secretary of State (European Affairs and Eurasian Affairs) with the time until 11:30 a.m. equally divided prior to a vote on the nomination.

*Ordered further*, That following disposition of the Donfried nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Monica P. Medina, of Maryland, to be Assistant Secretary of State for Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs and immediately recess until 2:15 p.m. to allow for the weekly caucus meetings.

*Ordered further*, That cloture having been invoked on the following nominations, all post-cloture time be considered expired, and the vote on confirmation of the nominations occur at a time and in an order to be determined by the Majority Leader, following consultation with the Republican Leader, with 1 hour of debate equally divided prior to each vote, and the Republican debate be controlled by the Senator from Texas (Mr. Cruz):

Karen Erika Donfried, of the District of Columbia, to be an Assistant Secretary of State (European Affairs and Eurasian Affairs);

Monica P. Medina, of Maryland, to be Assistant Secretary of State for Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs;

Mary Catherine Phee, of Illinois, a Career Member of the Senior Foreign Service, Class of Minister-Counselor, to be an Assistant Secretary of State (African Affairs);

Todd D. Robinson, of New Jersey, a Career Member of the Senior Foreign Service, Class of Career Minister, to be an Assistant Secretary of State (International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs); and  
Jessica Lewis, of Ohio, to be an Assistant Secretary of State (Political-Military Affairs).

*Ordered further*, That if any of the nominations are confirmed on Tuesday, September 28, 2021, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Sept. 23, 2021.*)
