## Unanimous Consent Agreement

*Ordered*, That at 12 noon Friday, June 14, 1996 the Senate return to Executive Session and resume consideration of the nomination of Alan Greenspan, to be Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System (Cal. No. 517) and all time for debate during Friday's session be equally divided between the Senator from New York (Mr. D'Amato) and the Senator from Iowa (Mr. Harkin), or their designees;

*Ordered, further*, That at 9:30 on Thursday, June 20, the Senate return to consideration of the nomination with 3 hours remaining for debate, equally divided;

*Ordered, further*, That a vote occur on the confirmation of the nomination at 2 o'clock on Thursday June 20, 1996;

*Ordered*, That immediately following the confirmation of the nominee, the Senate proceed to vote on the remaining nominees to the Federal Reserve System;

*Ordered, further*, That the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate return to legislative session.
