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## Unanimous Consent Agreement

*Ordered*, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader will prior to September 14, 1996, proceed to executive session to consider Cal. No. 12, The Chemical Weapons Convention, and the treaty be advanced through its various parliamentary stages up to and including the presentation of the resolution of ratification; that all reported conditions and declarations be deemed agreed to; that there be two additional amendments in order to the resolution of ratification by the Majority Leader or his designee dealing with the subject matter of the Chemical Weapons Convention; that there be one hour for debate on each amendment divided in the usual form; that no further conditions, amendments, declarations or understandings be in order; that there be 10 hours additional time for debate, to be equally divided in the usual form, and following the conclusion or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to adoption of the resolution of ratification, all without further action or debate.
