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## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

*Ordered, further,* That at 11 a.m. on Wednesday, April 4, the Senate proceed to Executive Session and consideration of the nomination of Timothy Ryan to be Director of the Office of Thrift Supervision (Cal. No. 682).
