Mar. 8, 1983-- Motion entered to reconsider the vote by which the resolution of ratification to the Montreal Protocols No. 3 and 4 (Ex. B., 95-1) was defeated--Mr. Baker.

UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Ordered, that the vote on the cloture motion of July 31, 1984, on the nomination of James Harvie Wilkinson III, of Virginia, to be U.S. Circuit Judge for the Fourth Circuit occur at 3:00 p.m., on Thursday, August 9, 1984, with the mandatory quorum under Rule XXII being waived;

Ordered, further, that at 2 p.m. on Thursday, August 9, the Senate go into executive session and resume consideration of the nomination, with debate equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary (Mr. Thurmond) and the Senator from Massachusetts (Mr. Kennedy) or their designees; and

Ordered, further, that if cloture is invoked on August 9th, the confirmation vote on the nomination occur immediately thereafter.

(August 2, 1984)

Ordered, that at 12 noon on Thursday, August 9, 1984, the Senate go into executive session to consider three treaties on the Executive Calendar (Treaty Calendar Nos. 23, 35 and 36) and that debate on the resolutions of advice and consent to ratification be limited to ten minutes total, to be equally divided and controlled by the Chairman and Ranking Minority Member of the Committee on Foreign Relations or their designees; and

Ordered, further, that immediately following the conclusion or yielding back of debate time, the Senate proceed to vote on the resolutions of advice and consent to ratification with one vote counting as three votes.
