Dear Secretary Granholm,

We are continuing oversight of questionable ethical conduct at the Department of Energy (DOE). It appears that acting Assistant Secretary for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy, Kelly Speakes-Backman, may be using her position to advance the interests of an energy association where she was most recently the Chief Executive Office (CEO) – the Energy Storage Association (ESA). On May 12, 2021, we first requested information about another conflict of interest regarding your relationship with Proterra, Inc. Your agency has failed to provide a substantive response. This lack of transparency and apparent pattern of ethical issues raises questions about the stewardship of the agency by the Biden Administration.

The ESA represents more than 200 businesses and is dedicated to advancing energy storage, including engaging with DOE to promote energy storage technologies.² According to media reports, Ms. Speakes-Backman has continuously mentioned the ESA while appearing in her official capacity at DOE.³ Ms. Speakes-Backman has even suggested publicly that DOE will be implementing initiatives that would likely benefit the ESA and its members.⁴ This appears to be a conflict of interest.

Ms. Speakes-Backman has also made several statements regarding new DOE initiatives that are similar to those proposed by ESA.⁵ For example, she stated at a public event that, "[b]ack in December 2020, when I was still with the Energy Storage Association, DOE published the energy storage grand challenge road map, then further explained, "I'm stealing this a little bit from my days at Energy Storage Association." Additionally, Ms. Speakes-Backman

delivered a keynote address at an event where her sponsor was a "leadership circle member" of the ESA and raises questions about whether she has been in continuous communications with her former employer. Between these instances and her public statements, Ms. Speakes-Backman has a pattern of working toward advancing the interests of the ESA. In addition to being a potential conflict of interest, this conduct may also violate President Biden's Ethics Pledge because of her active participation in policy decisions that are substantially related to ESA policies. It is imperative that all officials at DOE, particularly senior political appointees are taking their ethical obligations seriously and not using positions of public trust to benefit former employers. In order for Committee Republicans to determine if Ms. Speakes-Backman acted inappropriately, please provide the following documents and information as soon as possible but no later than July 27, 2021.

- (1) All documents and communications from January 20, 2021 to present by Ms. Speakes-Backman related to the Energy Storage Association.
- (2) All documents and communications from January 20, 2021 to present between Ms. Speakes-Backman and any employee at the Energy Storage Association.
- (3) All documents and communications from January 20, 2021 to present regarding the appearance by Ms. Speakes-Backman at the International Conservation Caucus Foundation panel.
- (4) All documents and communications from January 20, 2021 to present between Ms. Speakes-Backman and the Department of Energy related to the analysis of any conflict of interest.
