- Recommendation by an institution working in the area of sustainable development
- Demonstrated field experience and ongoing field activity
- _ Multidisciplinary focus and policy orientation
- Commitment to return to Belize following degree program

Fields of Study

The FB-OAS program, offers 24 grants to be shared among all the member countries of the OAS, including Belize. It encompasses all fields of study in the natural and social sciences related to the ecology and sustainable development of Latin America and the Caribbean.
