
The Eastern Massachusetts National Wildlife Refuge Complex is made up of eight national wildlife refuges throughout Massachusetts. This checklist has been developed for three of the Eastern Massachusetts Complex's inland refuges located on the Sudbury, Concord, Nashua, and Assabet Rivers. Great Meadows NWR is located in the towns of Sudbury, Wayland, Lincoln, Concord, Framingham, Bedford, Carlisle, and Billerica; Oxbow NWR is located in the towns of Harvard, Shirley, Lancaster, and Ayer; and the Assabet River NWR is located in the towns of Sudbury, Maynard, Hudson, and Stow.

The three refuges are composed of approximately 7,000 acres of diverse habitat, including open water, marshes, and uplands. The wetland portions receive heavy use by waterfowl during the fall migration. All of the over 220 species of birds listed here have been recorded in the past ten years.

Neotropical Migratory Birds Neotropical migratory birds are those species that nest in the United States or Canada, and spend the winter primarily south of our border in Mexico, Central or South America, or in the Caribbean. Many of them, including conspicuous or colorful hawks, hummingbirds, warblers, and tanagers, and less colorful but no less important flycatchers, thrushes, and vireos, are experiencing population declines due to widespread loss of habitats important for their survival. Preservation of many different habitats for nesting, wintering, and migratory stopover sites is becoming vital for the survival of many of these birds.
