



In a cooperative effort between the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, and the Black Bear Conservation committee, Louisiana black bear sows and cubs have been released on Red River WMA in an attempt to reestablish these threatened bears within their historical range. This area is not far from Lake Ophelia NWR and bears could easily be on the Refuge. Report all bear sightings on your self-clearing permit. Hunters must positively identify their target before pulling the trigger or releasing an arrow! Black bears and feral hogs are sometimes hard to distinguish in heavy cover. Black bears are a protected species in Louisiana.
