What may seem as a simple act to people who do not suffer from Paruresis is a terribly traumatic experience, which elicits feelings of shame, deep embarrassment, and self-hate because of being unable do to a phobia to not urinate before others. If I could have any other phobia I would, because it is very hard to say to others that I fear urinating in public. So, there must be a regulated way for people who suffer from Paruresis to be able to take a drug test that does not use urine.
