In response to the proposed Drug Testing guidelines, I wish to appeal to your compassion to your fellow man in incorporating guidance that will accomodate those of us who suffer from the condition called Paruresis, aka Shy Bladder syndrome.

I am a life long sufferer, presently serving my nation in the U.S. Air Force Reserve.

Though the Air Force (and military in general) impose the most inhumane form of urinanalysis testing with the 'direct observed' method, any method that does not afford discrete and dignified allowances for those of us who suffer from this condition, must be modified in such a way as to include alternate methods of testing.

These methods should include ways to ensure the privacy of disclosure of such a medical disability as Paruresis so that only the individual and the testing officials are involved.

No one else has any right to be aware of such a private personal condition.

Alternative drug testing methods that do not involve 'performance' by an individual must be persued and implemented.

If urinanalysis testing must continue, it should only implemented to allow the utmost in personal privacy so as to provide a level, humane and consistent procedure for all persons regardless of health or physical characteristics.
