INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARATION
Form RD 440-29

1. Enter the beginning and ending dates of the period covered by the semiannual report.
2. Include all construction, alteration, and repair contracts entered into *by the borrower or Agency* and subject to the provisions of RD Instruction 1940-C. Do not include subcontracts entered into by any contractor. RRII projects and constructed by the owner-builder method, with nine or more units assisted by the HUD Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments Program, will be reported as a prime contract.
3. Enter the total dollar amount of the contracts.
4. Enter the total dollar amount of contractors and subcontractors against whom the Agency received complaints.
5. Enter the total number of full-scale investigations completed. A full scale investigation is an investigation, complete and detailed, into the administration of labor standards provisions of the construction contract when there is a reason to believe there has been violation of contract clauses.
6. Enter the number of contractors and subcontractors found in violation as a result of the investigations reported in item 5 above. Do not count a contractor or subcontractor more than once in a single investigation because he/she has violated more than one Act, or because more than one contract is included in the investigation.
7. Enter the total amount of wage restitution which you *found due* employees of the contractor/subcontractors reported in item 6 above, showing under (a) the amount found due because of violations of the Davis-Bacon Act and under (b) the amount of wage restitution found due because of violations of the Contract Work Hours Standards Act.
8. Enter the number of employees to whom the wage restitution reported in item 7 above is due. This figure is the unduplicated count; that is, an employee due wage restitution as a result of an investigation shall be counted only once, regardless of the fact that he/she may be due wage restitution under the Davis-Bacon Act and also due wage restitution under the Contract Work Hours Standards Act.
9. Enter the total amount of liquidated damages assessed as a result of violations of the Contract Work Hours Standards Act, including any such amounts assessed by you as a result of investigations made by the Department of Labor.
10. Enter any explanation or comment considered necessary to a proper understanding of the report. A separate sheet may be attached if necessary.
