

Tucson Field Office Flood-Warning Gages

Sabino Creek near Summer Haven: Personnel from the USGS and Pima County Flood Control District installed a flood-warning stream gage at a discontinued USGS stream gage located two miles downstream of Summer Haven, on Sabino Creek. This is the uppermost flood-warning gage in the Sabino watershed.



Upper Canyon del Oro Wash: Personnel from the USGS and Pima County Flood Control District installed a flood-warning gage in a remote area of the upper Canyon del Oro watershed. This gage will provide flood warning to residents of Saddlebrook, Catalina, Oro Valley, and Tucson.



Canyon del Oro Wash near Saddlebrook: USGS technicians fortified a heavily eroded flood-warning gage upstream of Saddlebrook. This gage provides flood warning to the residents of Saddlebrook, Catalina, Oro Valley, and Tucson.



Canyon del Oro Wash in Catalina: USGS technicians installed a vertical staff that is used by Golder Ranch Fire Department to gage the depth of the river at the road crossing and to report flood stages to Pima County Flood Control District.



Canyon del Oro Wash at Golder Ranch Road: Personnel from the USGS and Pima County Flood Control District installed a flood-warning gage that utilizes acoustic technology to accurately measure flood stages in the wash. This gage provides flood warning to the residents of Oro Valley and Tucson.
