## **COLONEL FLOYD L. CARPENTER**



Colonel Floyd L. Carpenter is commander, Air Force Officer Accession and Training Schools, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala. As commander, he is the single point manager for approximately 17,000 students in the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program, 2,500 students in Officer Training School and more than 103,000 students involved in the Air Force Junior ROTC program at 744 locations. Colonel Carpenter was recently selected for promotion to the rank of brigadier general.

Colonel Carpenter received his commission through the Corps of Cadets ROTC program at Texas A&M University in 1977. Colonel Carpenter deployed to a forward operating location as the commander, 40<sup>th</sup> Air Expeditionary Wing, from November 2002 until

May 2003. During that time, he directed combat forces in support of Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom. His forces included B-52, B-2 and KC-135 aircraft as well as more than 1,500 troops. He is a command pilot with more than 3,800 hours in B-52s and T-38s and has commanded at the squadron, group and wing levels. Before assuming command of AFOATS, Colonel Carpenter served as the commander, 2<sup>nd</sup> Bomb Wing, Barksdale Air Force Base, La., where he was responsible for maintaining the wing in a state of constant readiness to carry out bombardment operations on a global scale. He ensured the organization, training and equipage of a combined active duty and civilian force of more than 5,400 people assigned to the wing.
