In accordance with Section 647(b) of Division F of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, FY 2004, P.L. 108-199, the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) hereby provides its report on competitive sourcing efforts through September 30, 2003. Responses for items (1) through (7) of Section 647 (b) are provided on the attachments in accordance with the guidance provided by the Office of Management and Budget.

In response to item (8), the SBA estimates that 330 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) positions will be studied in competitions SBA plans to announce in FY 2004. In response to item (9), SBA has aligned its competitive sourcing activities with our transformation efforts and the human capital strategies being executed under the President's Management Agenda. Activities identified for transformation are not included in current competitions. In addition, to the extent feasible, high priority program and operational staffing needs and longer-term succession plans will be addressed through competition outcomes. All commercial activities selected for competitive study are expected to benefit from restructuring and improve ment resulting in increased customer service levels, improved productivity and performance, and lower annual operating costs.
