Status of Activities

- Drafting EIS
 - Identified preliminary alternatives
 - Analyzing Impacts of alternatives
 - Biological
 - Environmental
 - Economic
 - Social





Alternatives Being Analyzed

- Open entire EEZ to Atlantic striped bass harvest following the recommendation from ASMFC
 - 28" minimum size
 - allow states the ability to adopt more restrictive rules for fishermen and vessels licensed in their jurisdiction.





- Open entire EEZ to Atlantic striped bass harvest
 - 28" minimum size
 - allow states the ability to adopt more restrictive rules for fishermen and vessels licensed in their jurisdiction
 - require circle hooks for all hook & line bait fishing
 - adopt a 2-fish bag limit for recreational fishing
 - adopt one of the following sub-alternatives for commercial fishing:
 - commercial trip limit of 100 fish per trip; or
 - restrict commercial harvest to bycatch-only by imposing a limit of no more than x% of the total catch or 100 fish per trip, whichever is less.





- Open entire EEZ to Atlantic striped bass harvest
 - hook & line gear, only
 - require circle hooks for <u>all</u> bait fishing
 - 28" minimum size
 - allow states the ability to adopt more restrictive rules for fishermen and vessels licensed in their jurisdiction
 - adopt a 2-fish bag limit for recreational fishing
 - adopt one of the following sub-alternatives for commercial fishing:
 - commercial trip limit of 100 fish per trip; or
 - restrict commercial harvest to bycatch-only by imposing a limit of no more than x% of the total catch or 100 fish per trip, whichever is less.





- No Action
 - Status quo
 - maintain moratorium in EEZ



Other Alternatives Considered

- Open EEZ with no restrictions
- Recreational fishing, only
- Catch and release, only
- Other minimum sizes, besides 28"
- Season/area closures
- Prohibit gillnet
- Open EEZ and apply state regulations





Next Steps

- Finish analyses and the Draft EIS
- Announce availability of DEIS
- Open Comment period
- Hold Public hearings on DEIS and associated alternatives
- Determine whether to move forward with a proposed rule





Input to Process

- We are developing e- and postal mailing lists of interested parties so we can distribute the DEIS for public comments, as soon as it is available.
- <u>However</u>, since we are in rulemaking, we can not accept <u>comments</u> until we are in a public <u>comment period</u> which will be announced once the DEIS is available
