National Endowment for the Arts <u>FY 2002 PERFORMANCE REPORT</u> February 2003

As required by the Government Performance and Results Act of 1993, the National Endowment for the Arts is pleased to submit its Annual Performance Report for Fiscal Year 2002. The report is based on and covers performance goals and indicators contained in the Performance Plan for FY 2002. The table that follows compares the Arts Endowments revised final Fiscal Year 2002 performance projections as of January 17, 2003 with the projections presented with the Agencys FY 2004 Initial Performance Plan.

General Observations. As discussed in our Performance Reports for other years, one must take several significant issues into account when assessing Agency performance for FY 2002:

- First, since applications for FY 2002 funds had not been fully acted upon by the time the Performance Plan for the year was initially submitted, we used available FY 2000 and FY 2001 data as a baseline for making projections, as well as data from the FY 2002 applications processed by March 2002. As previously noted in other reports, actual performance data from each fiscal year is not available until final reports on funded projects have been received, related information entered into our database, and those data assessed. As of January 17, 2003 3 ½ months after the end of the fiscal year –just 18 percent of final reports for FY 2002 grants had been received. Based on our experience, it is likely that we will have exceeded a 90 percent return rate, the level we currently estimate to be sufficient to make final assessments of a year's performance, by the time we submit our FY 2006 Performance Plan (in February 2005).
- Second, because of the timing of this report's preparation, actual performance data is limited. Because we now update GPRA-related data during the revised project/budget process (an opportunity for applicants to revise their projects and budgets in response to their tentatively recommended award amounts), these Fiscal Year 2002 projections reflect estimates from application forms, revised project/budget forms, and actual performance data from the few final reports submitted by grantees by January 17, 2003.
- Third, eligible applicants to the Arts Endowment have full discretion in choosing the funding area from which to seek support, and in determining the nature of their projects. The Arts Endowment issues application guidelines that organizations use to submit requests for support. The guidelines identify areas of funding (e.g., Access to the Arts) that directly relate to each of our goals. The guidelines also broadly address the types of eligible projects (e.g., creation of artwork, arts instruction, residencies). Based on historical data, we estimate numbers of applications and types of projects or activities to be funded; however, it is not until the applications are received and reviewed that a clearer picture emerges. From year to year, applicant interests may change from one area to another or from one type of project to another, thus adding to the challenge of making reliable estimates. This year, in fact, we chose to delay estimating activity *levels* until the submission of this report to allow for more realistic projections. To a large extent then, adjustments in our projections reflect this external factor.

Challenge America Funds. In the table that follows, there are three areas (Access, Creativity, and Community Arts Development) in which there appear to be notable changes since we submitted our FY 2003 Performance Plan. In fact, these apparent changes reflect our decision to shift funds among goals in order to capture data consistent with our budget presentation and tables (e.g., moving funds from Community Arts Development and Access to Creativity), rather than a change in focus.
