Biographical Information

Walter L. Warnick, Director, Office of Scientific and Technical Information Since becoming Director of the Office of Scientific and Technical Information (OSTI) www.osti.gov in 1997, Dr. Warnick has championed an aggressive effort to capitalize on technological advances to provide state-of-the-art information tools and services to the Department of Energy community, intergovernmental and international partners, students and the public. During his tenure at OSTI, groundbreaking new tools have made DOE information access quicker, cheaper, more convenient and more complete than ever before. In 2001, Warnick received both the DOE Information Technology Quality Award for Executive Leadership and the government-wide Interagency Resources Management Conference (IRMCO) Individual Award for demonstration of exceptional ability to operate across organizational boundaries to improve the government's service to its people. Recognizing that the boundaries of science disciplines do not necessarily coincide with organizational boundaries, Warnick championed the interagency development of Science.gov, the gateway for R&D results and related government science information.

David Bradshaw, Mayor of Oak Ridge

David Bradshaw is serving his second two-year term as Mayor of Oak Ridge. He has served on the Oak Ridge City Council since 1995, and was elected Mayor Pro Tem under three Mayors in Oak Ridge prior to his first term election as Mayor in June 2001. Bradshaw is Chief Operating Officer for Southeast Community Capital, a non-profit lender headquartered in Oak Ridge providing capital for start-up and early stage companies.

Eleanor G. Frierson, Deputy Director, National Agricultural Library

Eleanor G. Frierson has more than twenty years' diversified experience in information service development and management at national and international levels. Before coming to the National Agricultural Library in 2000 she served as Chief, Bureau of Library and Information Services of the International Labour Office, the secretariat of the International Labour Organization, in Geneva, Switzerland. Frierson has been co-chair since the spring of 2001 of the Science.gov Alliance, which developed the www.science.gov interagency science information gateway.

Paul Mamo, Portfolio Manager, Government to Citizen Initiatives, Office of Management and Budget

In his current position at OMB, Paul Mamo works in the Office of Electronic Government and Information Technology and is the Portfolio Manager for the Government to Citizen Initiatives in the President's Management Agenda on E-Government. These citizen-centered initiatives are designed to make it simpler for the public to electronically interact and obtain services from the government. Prior to accepting this detail position to OMB, Mamo was the Director of the Internal Revenue Service's E-Government Program Office located in the Electronic Tax Administration organization. At IRS, he managed the PMA E-Gov initiatives, Expanding Electronic Tax Products for Businesses and Free File (i.e., Free Tax Preparation and Filing web site located on www.irs.gov).

Raymond L. Orbach, Director, Office of Science

Dr. Raymond L. Orbach was sworn in as the 14th Director of the Office of Science at the Department of Energy on March 14, 2002. As Director of the Office of Science, Orbach manages an organization that is the third largest federal sponsor of basic research in the United States and is viewed as one of the premier science organizations in the world. The Office of Science funds programs in high energy and nuclear physics, basic energy sciences, magnetic fusion energy, biological and environmental research, and computational science; and provides management oversight of the Chicago and Oak Ridge Operations Offices, the Berkeley and Stanford Site Offices, and 10 DOE non-weapons laboratories. Prior to his appointment, Orbach served as Chancellor of the University of California, Riverside from April 1992 through March 2002, and now holds the title Chancellor Emeritus. Orbach began his academic career as a postdoctoral fellow at Oxford University in 1960 and became an assistant professor of applied physics at Harvard University in 1961. He joined the faculty of the University of California, Los Angeles two years later as an associate professor, and became a full professor in 1966. From 1982 to 1992, he served as the Provost of the College of Letters and Science at UCLA. Dr. Orbach's research in theoretical and experimental physics has resulted in the publication of more than 240 scientific articles.
