Kaplan, Robin Cooper / 1997 (Represents the single best resource for understanding and implementing activity-based cost management. Provides a detailed and comprehensive blueprint to enable managers to make better decisions and to promote organizational learning and improvement.)
- The death of common sense / Philip K. Howard / 1994 (The topic is bureaucratic overkill; how the law, legality, and bureaucratic process has led to our losing our common sense and *individual sense of responsibility*.)

Gansler / 1995 (In order to create a functional and affordable 21st century defense industrial base the author suggests improving the customer's habits, using cost-reduction accounting, off-the-shelf procurement, and privatization of maintenance and administration.)

- From Lexington to Desert Storm: war and politics in the American experience / Donald M. Snow / 1994 (Offers good points on the political-military theory of employing force in a democracy.)
- The general's war: the inside story of conflict in the Gulf / Michael R. Gordon / 1995 (May be the best single volume yet written about the Gulf War, "warts and all".)
- God has ninety-nine names: reporting from a militant Middle East. / Judith Miller / 1996
 (Chronicles the development of Islamic fundamentalism in ten Middle Eastern nations that are either battling religious militancy or have become politically radical..)
- Japan at war: an oral history / Haruko Taya Cook / 1992 (A must read for those who want to understand Japan during WWII and gain appreciation for present-day Japan. This book examines political decisions and military strategy while offering insight towards understanding other cultures)
- Managing generation X: how to bring out the best in young talent / Bruce Tulgan / 1997 (This book points out that the post baby boom generation needs different motivation and supervision than those preceding them. Their reputation for being difficult and apathetic in the workplace is considered a mistaken stereotype. It explains how they simply need different motivation and supervision.)
- The prize: the epic quest for oil, money, and power / Daniel Yergin / 1990 (An epic account of the oil industry and international politics.)
- The rise and fall of the great powers: economic change and military conflict from 1500 to 2000 / Paul Kennedy / 1987 (Focuses on the critical relationship of economic to military power as it affects the rise and fall of great empires of the world over the past five centuries.)
- Shield of the Republic: the United States Navy in an era of cold war and violent peace 1945-1962 / Michael T. Isenberg / 1993 (A vivid, nuanced, often witty log on the modern Navy. An epic-sized book, the author displays a refreshingly light touch without undermining the seriousness of his purpose. A truly comprehensive account, but well worth the effort.)

Talks about initial shortcomings, failings, and the subsequent resurgence of the Army. First person accounts and a continuing focus on the importance of cohesion and what it takes to fight and win a "limited war".)

Norton / 1996 (If you have a "strategic plan" look at this system that not only measures, but manages such elusive goals as mission, vision, customer satisfaction and employee satisfaction. A framework by which a company's vision and strategy is translated into a coherent set of performance measures that sustain your best efforts to improve.)
- Bible and sword: England and Palestine from the Bronze Age to Balfour / Barbara W. Tuchman / 1956-1984 (Provides insight into events that led to the founding of the modern Jewish state and to present day problems in the Mideast with a detailed account of the events leading up to the "settlement" of Palestine after World War I.)
- The eagle in the desert: looking back on U.S. involvement in the Persian Gulf War / Wm. Head, ed. / 1996 (The continued search for meaning from this conflict and an attempt to place it in its historical perspective.)
- The future of capitalism: how today's economic forces shape tomorrow's world / Lester C. Thurow / 1996 (A look at how the economy, demographics, and knowledge are changing the world, and how to achieve global prosperity.)
