Background:	Over the past 11 years, the President has signed several executive orders that promote and mandate the Greening of the Federal Government. That is, the Government will commit to protecting the environment through energy efficiency, recycling, pollution prevention, and affirmative procurement. These executive orders are far reaching, and affect all Federal Government agencies. In the past 2 years, Executive Order 13221 was signed which addressed energy efficient standby power devices. The purpose of this Policy Memorandum is to outline each executive order as it pertains to procurement and to provide the action needed to be taken by procurement personnel.
