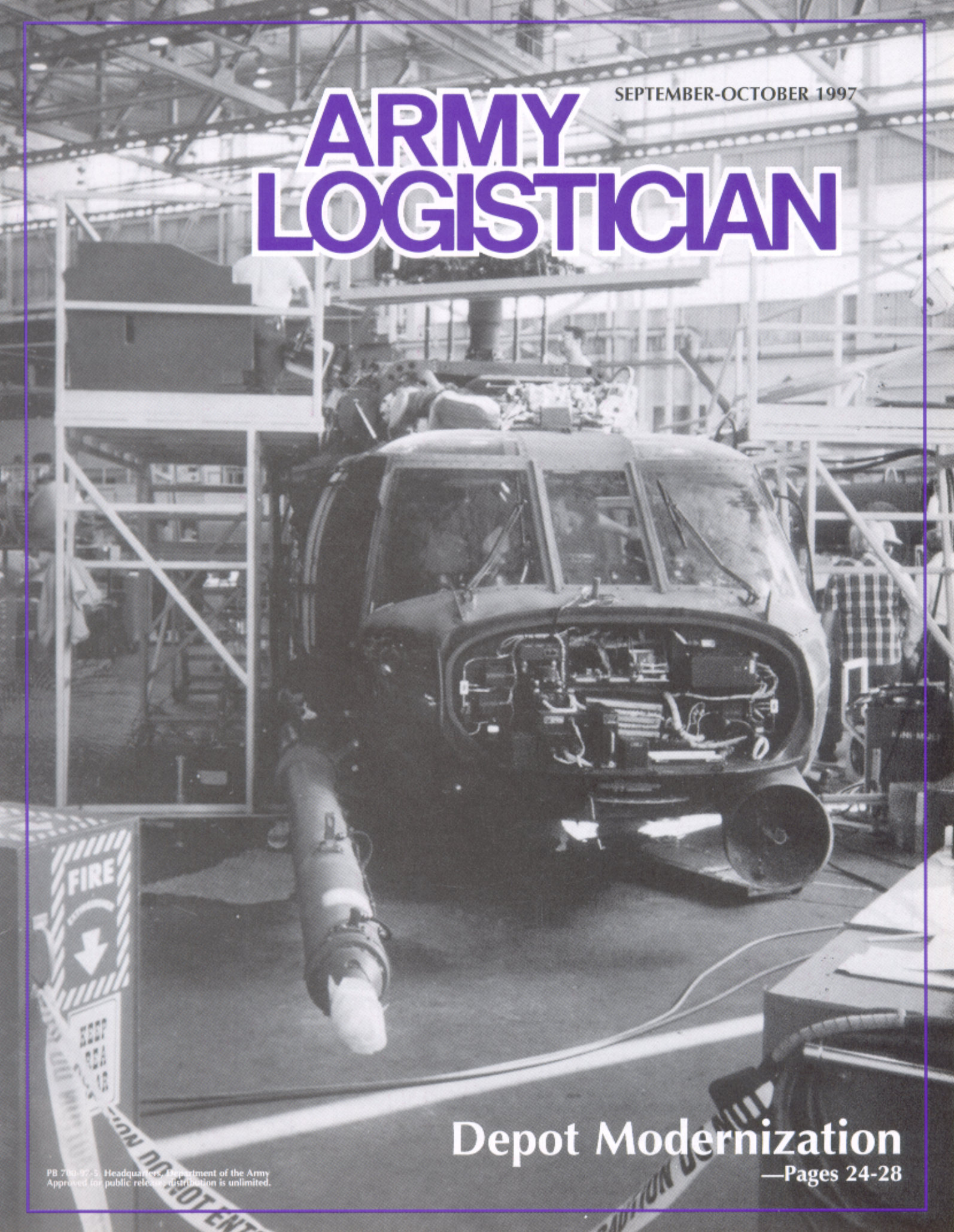

COVER


