Through this assistance, the CDFI Fund will help to grow an organization serving an underserved and difficult rural market.

Its Technical Assistance Award will enable the Abilities Fund to engage in market research, develop a web site, develop loan policies/procedures, and purchase office technology.

It recently expanded to the three other nearby cities of Bettendorf, Iowa, and Rock Island, and Moline, Illinois and the surrounding seven county area, with the expansion they changed their name to Mississippi Valley NHS (MVNHS). The Fund's support in the form of \$250,000 grant and \$250,000 loan will enable MVNHS to provide more first mortgage loans across this region.

Neighborhood Finance Corporation is a nonprofit affordable housing lender that was established in 1990 to address the deterioration of the housing stock affordable to lower income households, and the declining rate of home ownership in Des Moines, Iowa. Since its inception, Neighborhood Finance Corporation has originated more than \$66 million in residential loans and forgivable loans to predominantly low income individuals. Neighborhood Finance Corporation actively participates with local public agencies and banks to fund and leverage its loans. The technical assistance award will be used to provide staff training and obtain consulting services.

Neighborhood Finance Corporation (NFC) targets services to halt deterioration in Des Moines' low-and moderate-income central city neighborhoods. The organization provides home purchase/rehab loans for owner-occupied single- or multi-family housing. From 1998 to 2000, the organization has originated an annual average of 92 home purchase loans totaling \$5.1 million, 35 home improvement loans totaling \$690,000 and 14 construction and development loans totaling \$650,000. NFC also offers contract refinance and rehab loans and investor rental property mortgage for first or second mortgages on affordable housing projects. NFC has been awarded \$2,500,000 (\$1,500,000 in grant funds and \$1,000,000 in loan funds) to expand its investor mortgage program and short-term bridge financing for construction, and to explore commercial real estate lending.

The Institute for Social and Economic Development (ISED), founded in 1987, was one of the earliest microenterprise programs in the United States focusing specifically on poverty alleviation. Having proven its staying power while maintaining a strong and aggressive commitment to serving its low-income clientele, ISED is recognized for its comprehensive program design and its commitment to promote the evolution of the microenterprise field through impact measurement. With community-based offices in Cedar Rapids, Davenport, Des Moines, Sioux City and Waterloo, ISED was one of the earliest statewide microenterprise development models in the nation. ISED targets wel-



fare recipients and low-income entrepreneurs with the goal of enabling their clients to become successful business owners and enhance their self-sufficiency. ISED also targets economically distressed urban neighborhood and remote rural communities as a means of facilitating economic revitalization. Since its creation, ISED has served approximately 5,000 clients.
