

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National Perspective on Local Traffic Woes

- Problem for energy security
 - 7 billion gallons wasted fuel/year
- Problem for businesses and workers
 - "Rush hour" now 6 to 7 hours per day
 - Total delay of 4.5 billion hours per year
 - \$80 billion per year in lost worker productivity and fuel



Commuting and the Environment

- Vehicle emissions contribute to air pollution and global climate change
 - 1 gal. gasoline = 20 lbs. of climate change pollution (CO_2)
 - Passenger vehicles cause 20% of U.S. climate change pollution
- Air pollution and global climate change are on the rise
 - Driving has more than doubled since 1970 to 2.5 trillion miles per year
 - SUVs and minivans are now half of auto market *polluting* 3 to 5 times more than cars
 - 80% are "drive-alone" trips



Costs to Commuters

- Commuting costs American workers money
 - \$1,800/year in vehicle expenses
 - \$600/year on gas due to congestion
- Commuting costs American workers time
 - 500 vehicle trips each year
 - 160 hours driving per year (1 month work time)
 - 38 high-stress hours delayed in traffic



Is Change Possible?

- These facts indicate --- YES!
 - Nearly 50% of workers describe their commutes as unsatisfying or stressful
 - 36% of workers say they would be willing to take a 10% pay cut or more for a shorter commute (2001 Career Builder Survey, *HR Magazine*, October 2001)



How Do We Encourage Change?

- Offer commuter benefits!
 - Employees with commuter benefits are <u>8 times</u> more likely to use transit than those who don't have them (2001 Xylo Survey)
 - U.S. employers spend \$36 billion annually on employee parking (KPMG Peat Marwick study)



What Commuter Benefits Can Do

 When employers provide an outstanding level of commuter benefits, 10% to 30% of employees will shift transportation "modes"



What is Best Workplaces for CommutersSM?

- Regionally and nationally recognizes employers that meet or exceed a National Standard of Excellence in commuter benefits
- More than 1,000 employers and 12 Best Workplaces for Commuters Districts participate nationwide covering nearly 2 million commuters
- Dozens of supporting organizations in cities across the country

- Designate contact person, centralize information, and disseminate benefits information to employees
- Offer excellent commuter benefits package
 - Guaranteed/Emergency Ride Home program
 - One of four primary options
 - Three or more supporting options (1 if < 20 employees)
- Meet participation level (14% non-SOV)
- Report success
 - Basic information updated annually
 - Mode split reported every other year
