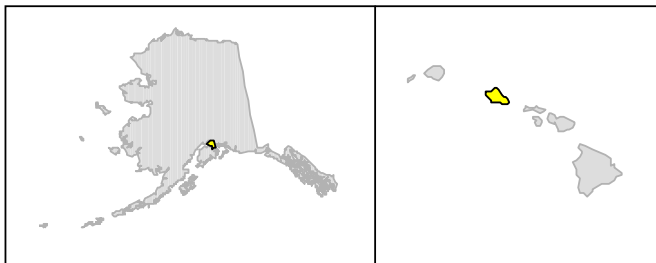
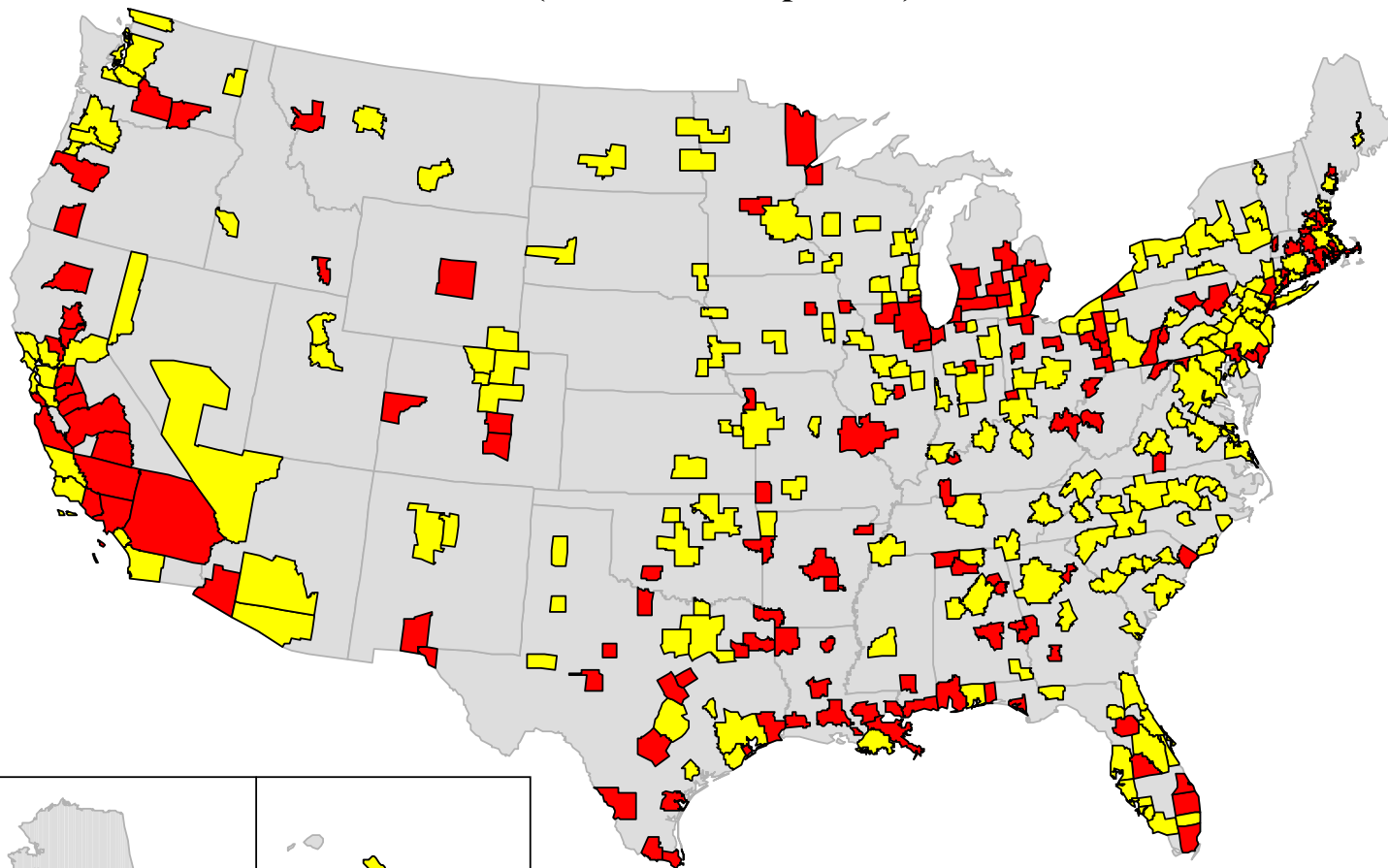


Unemployment rates by metropolitan area, 1990 annual averages

(U.S. rate = 5.6 percent)



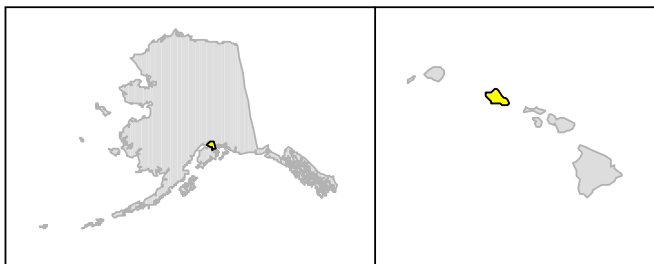
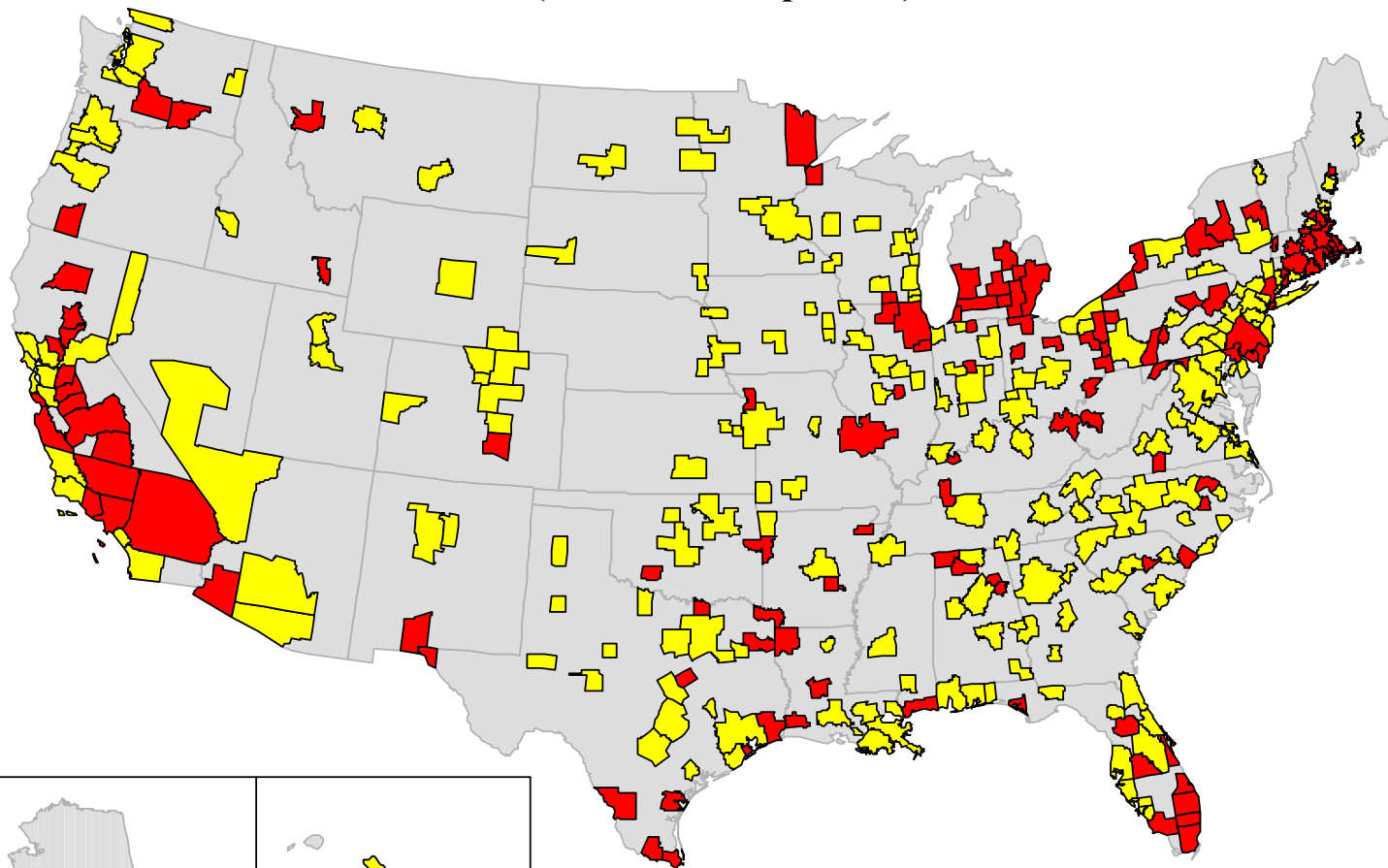

(U.S. rate = 6.8 percent)



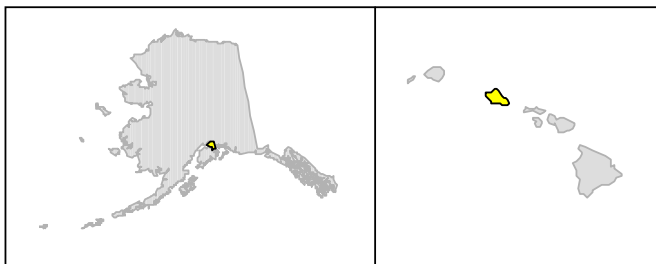
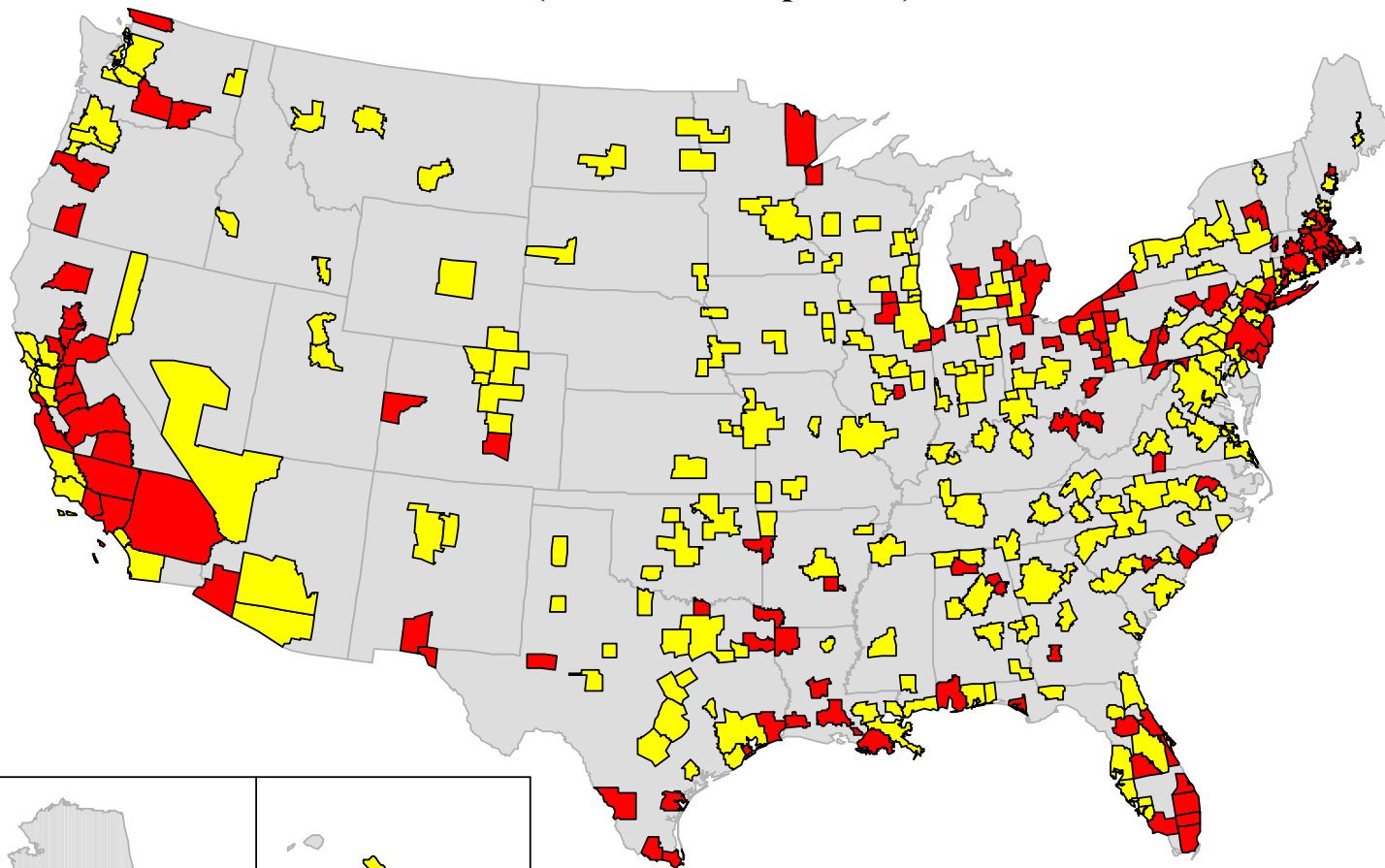

(U.S. rate = 7.5 percent)



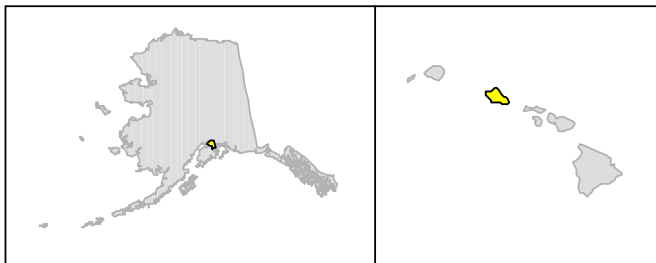
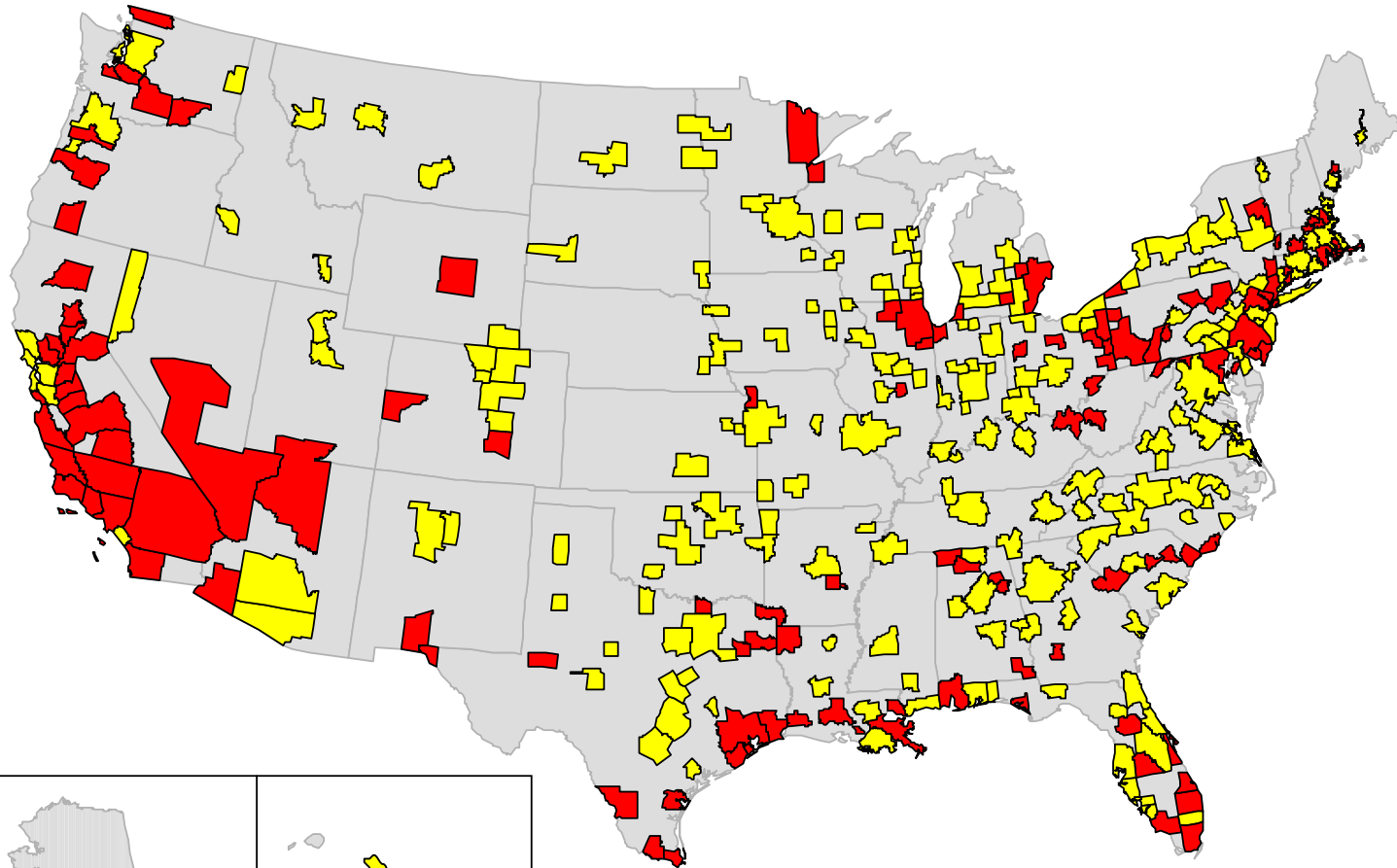

(U.S. rate = 6.9 percent)



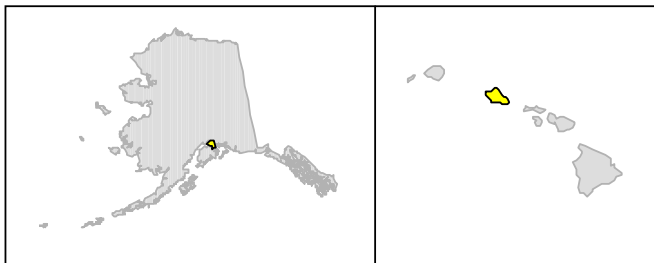
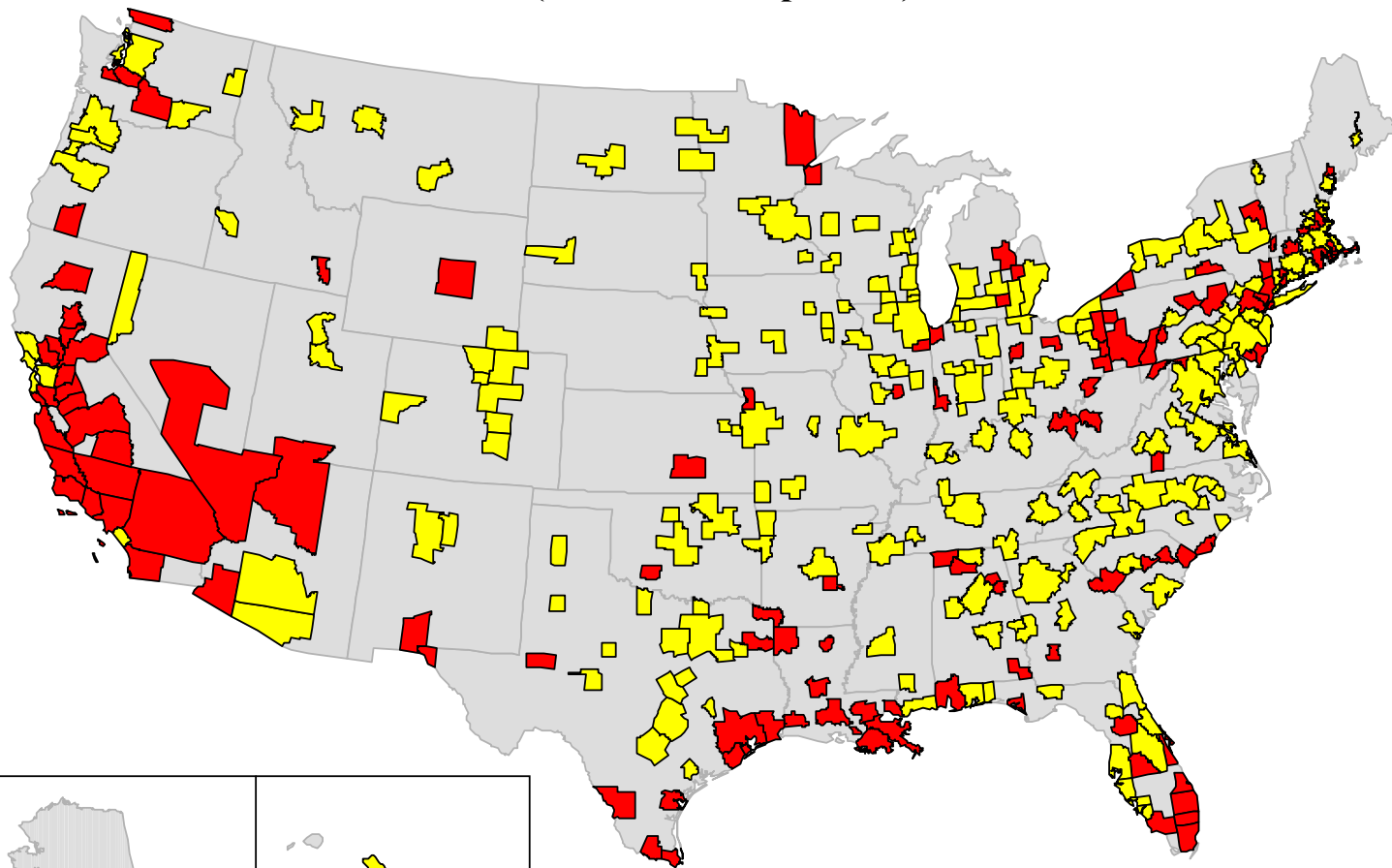

(U.S. rate = 6.1 percent)



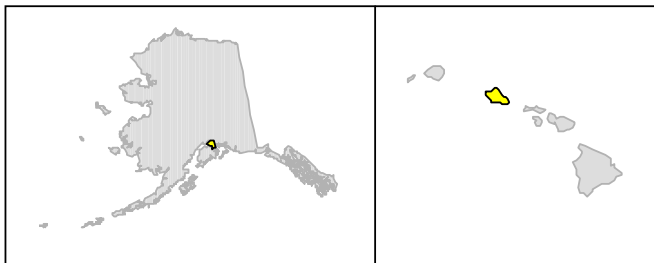
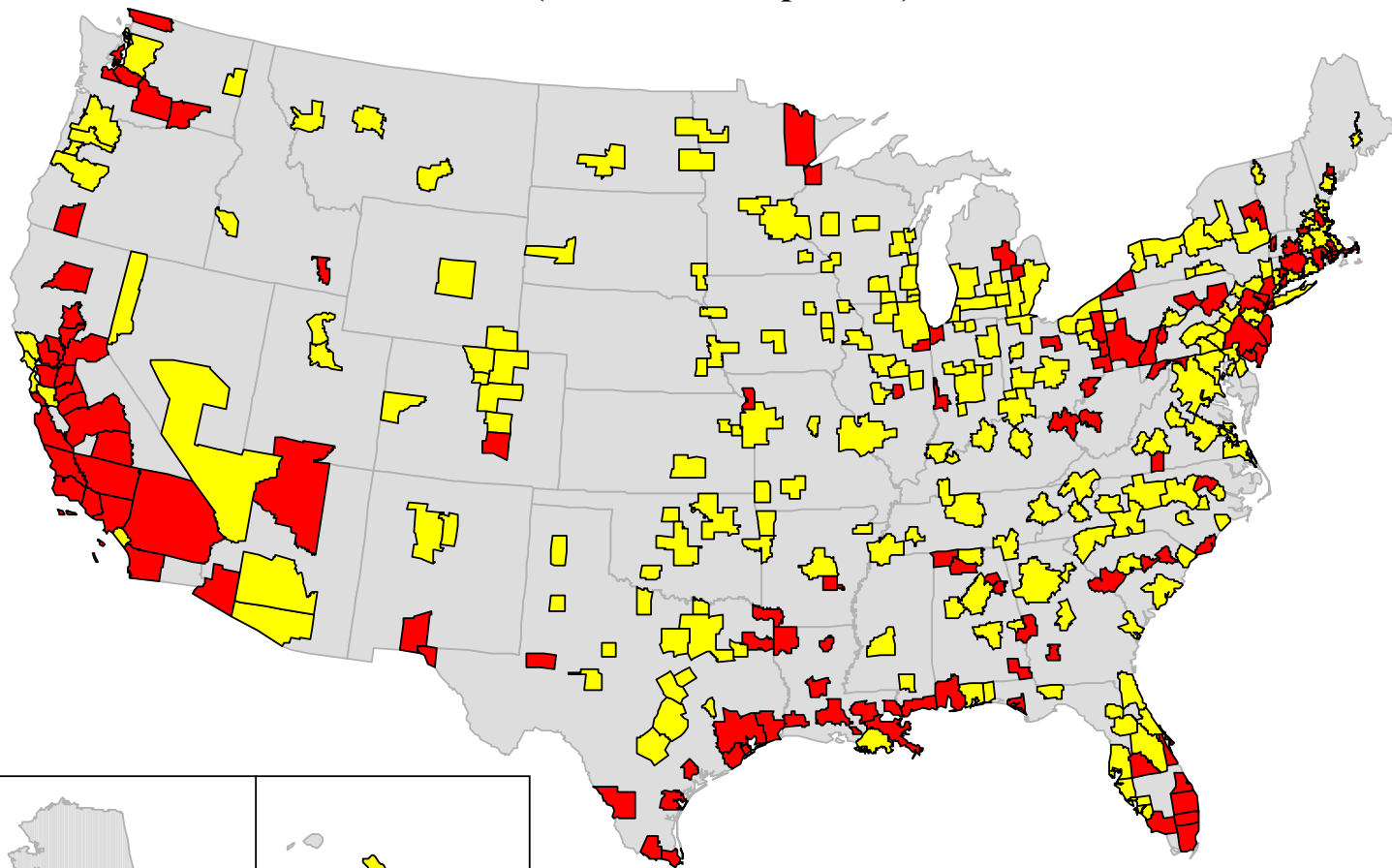

(U.S. rate = 5.6 percent)



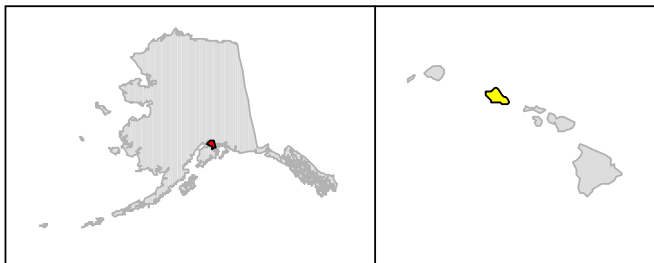
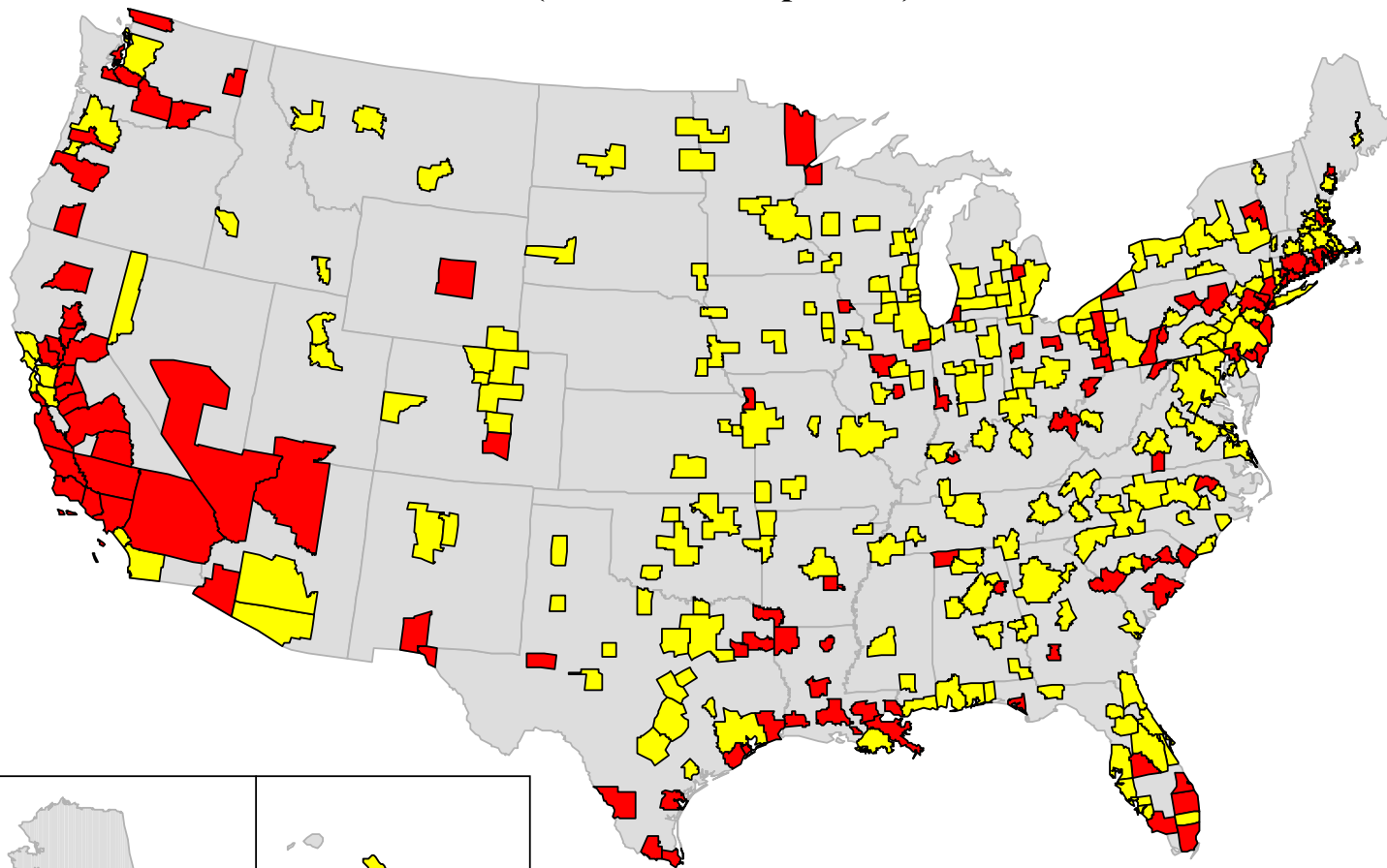

(U.S. rate = 5.4 percent)



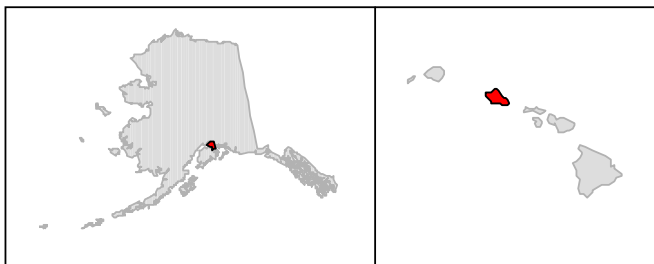
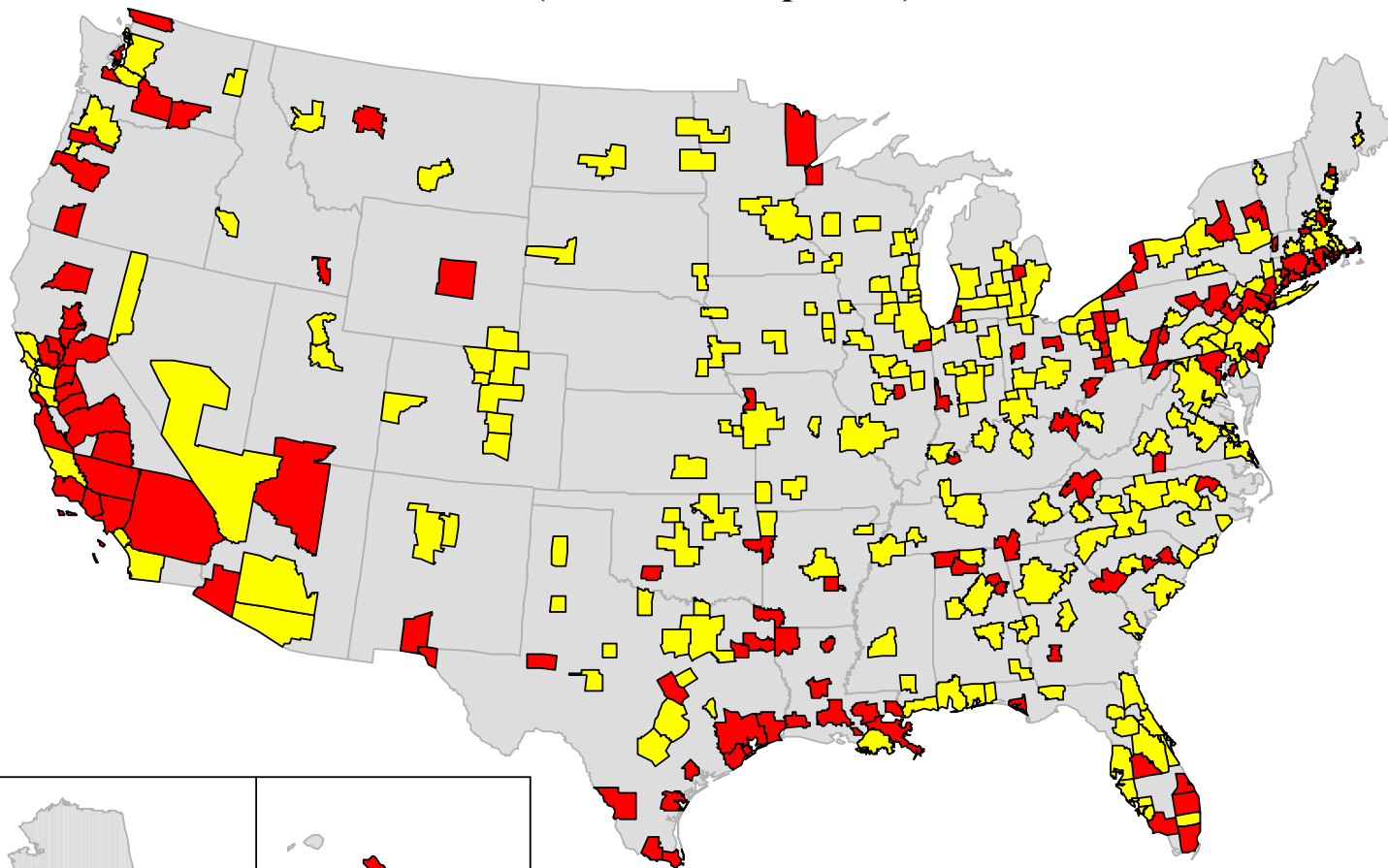

(U.S. rate = 4.9 percent)



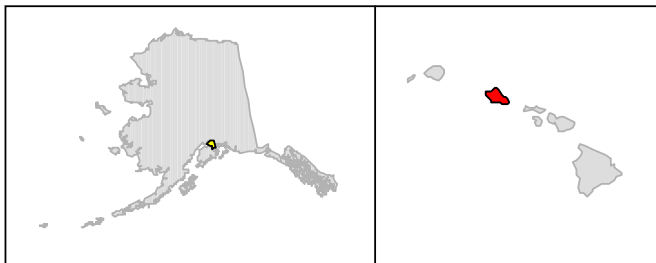
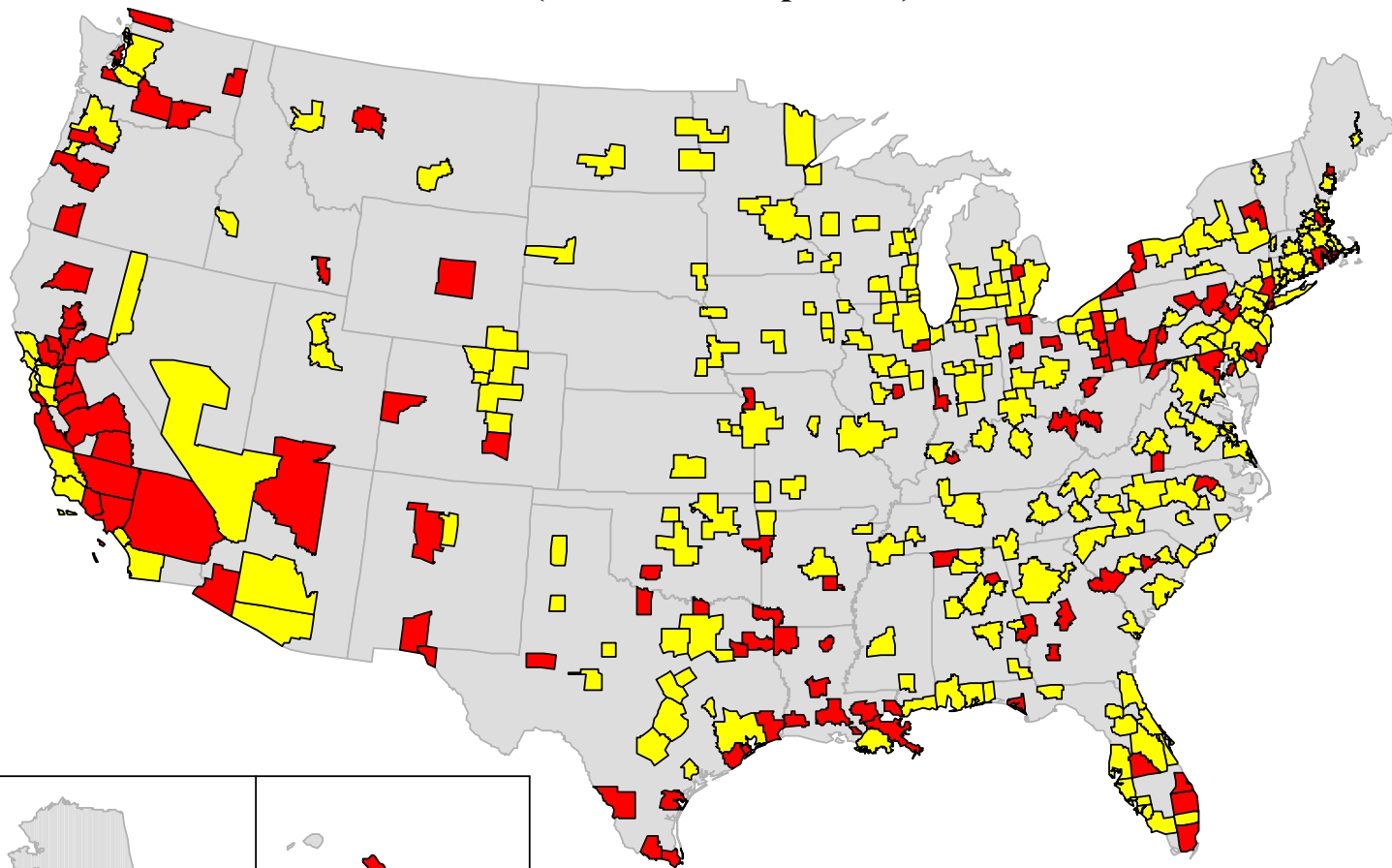

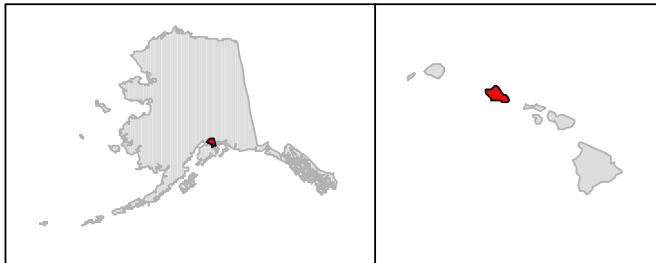

(U.S. rate = 4.2 percent)



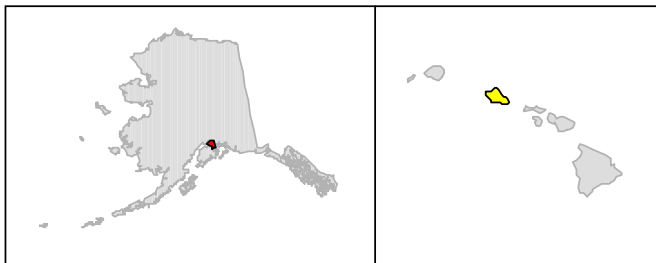
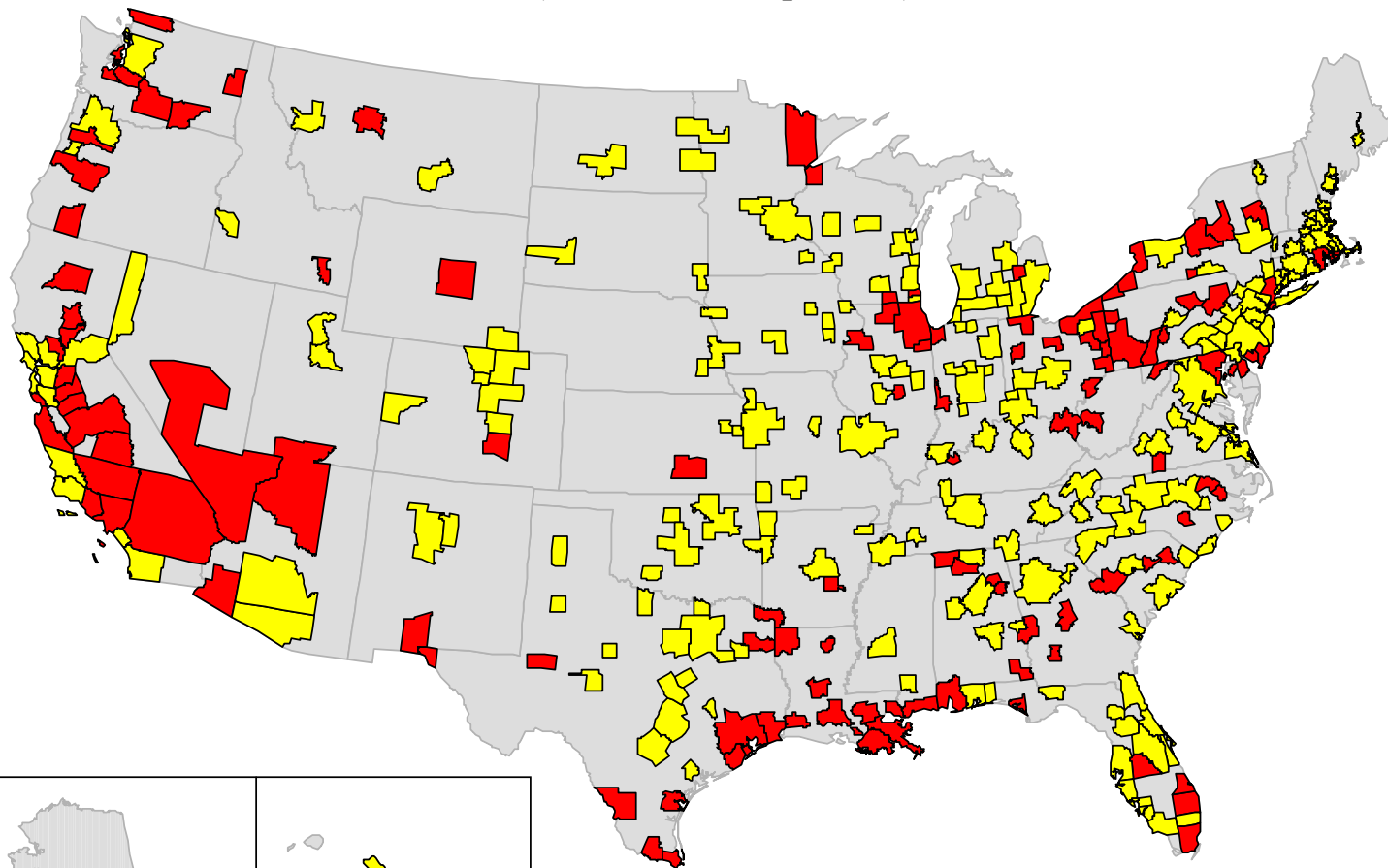

(U.S. rate = 4.0 percent)



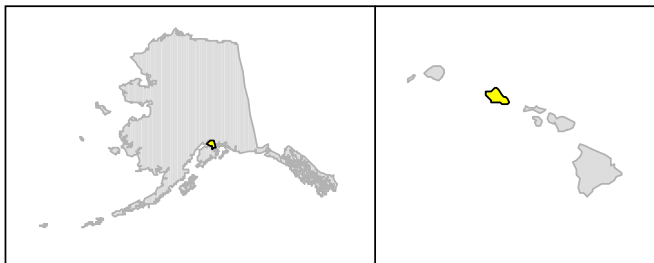
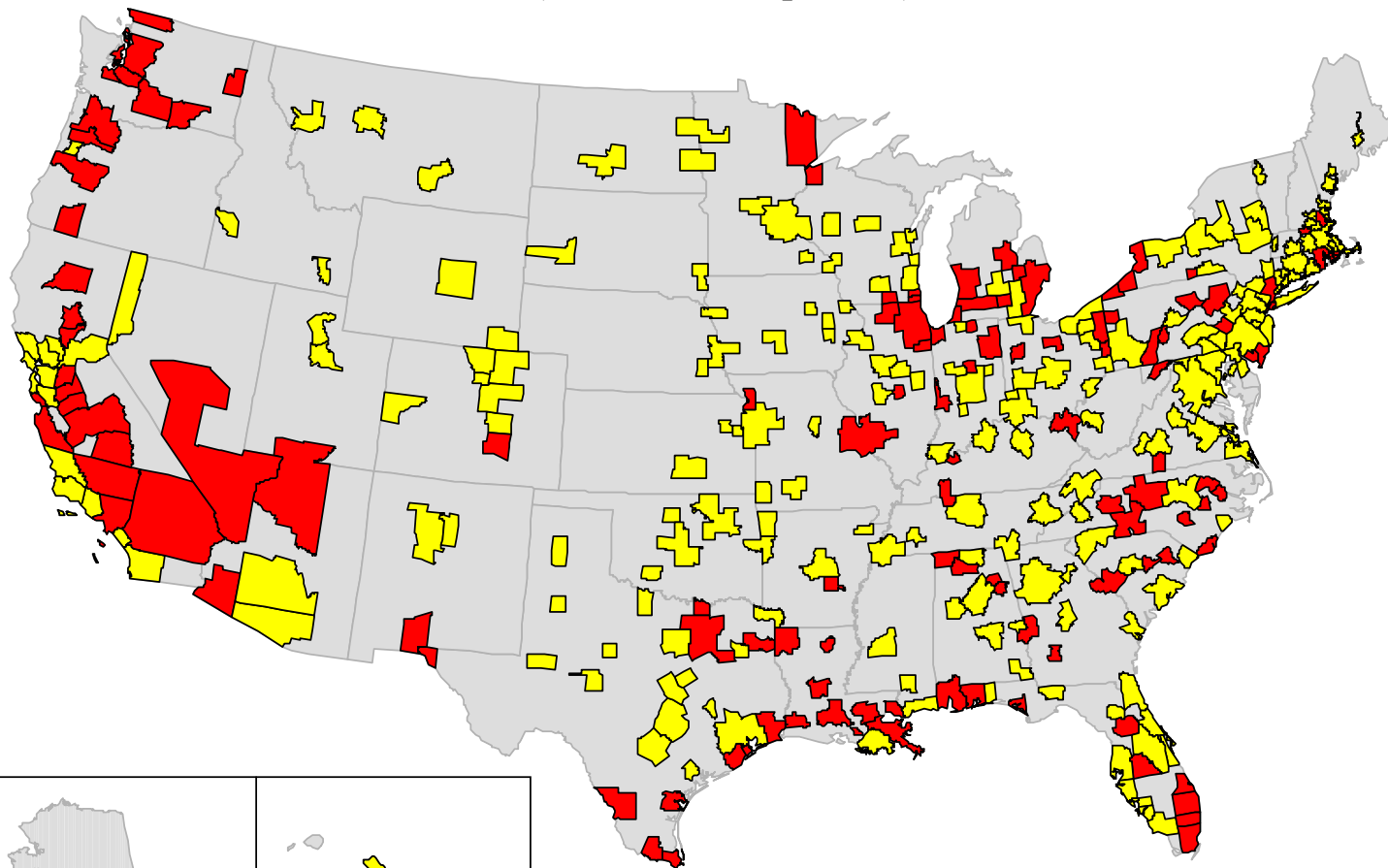

(U.S. rate = 4.7 percent)



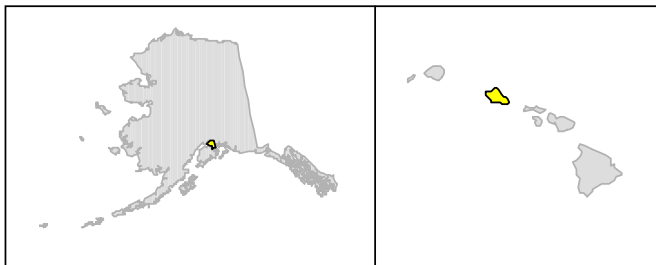
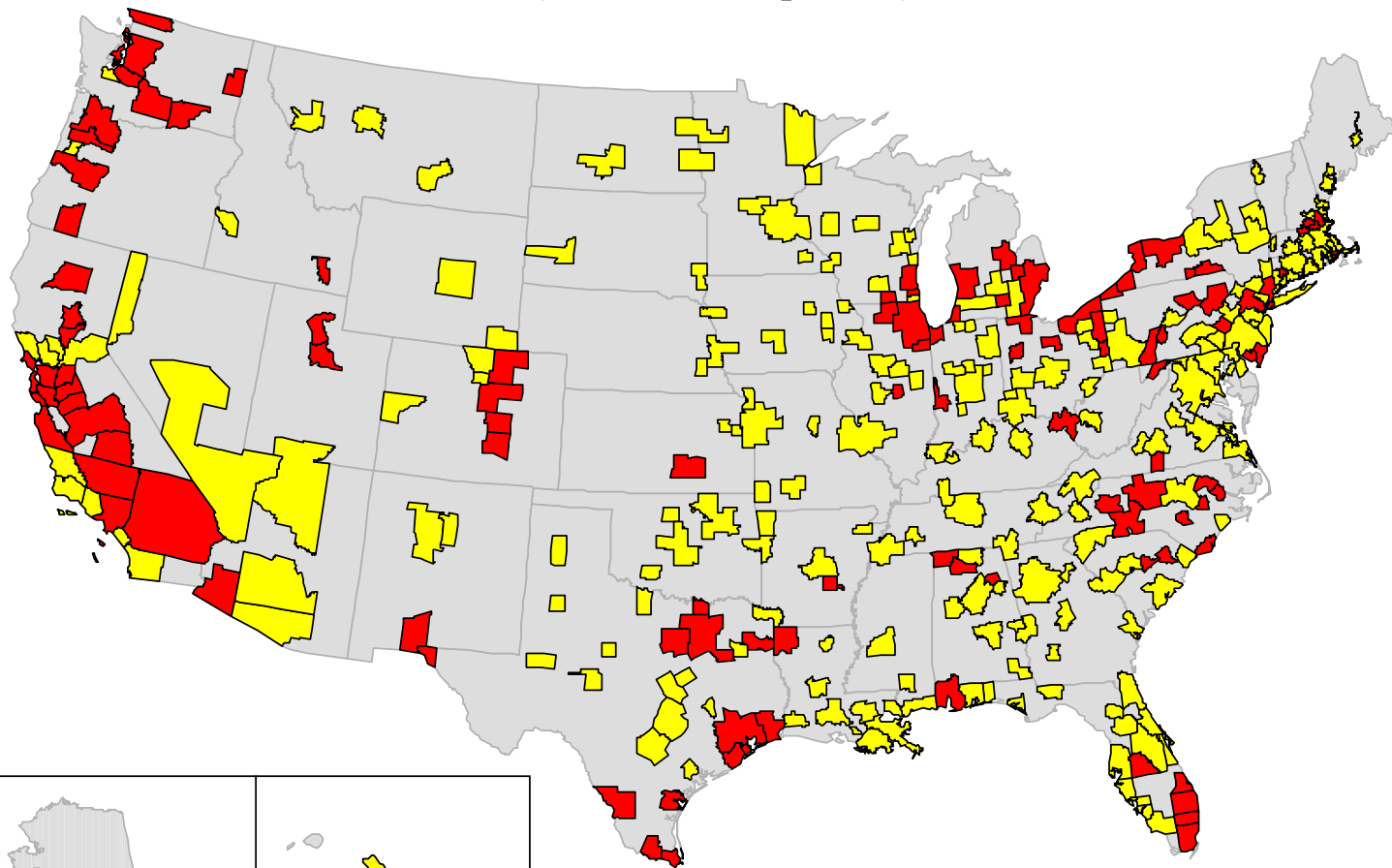

(U.S. rate = 5.8 percent)



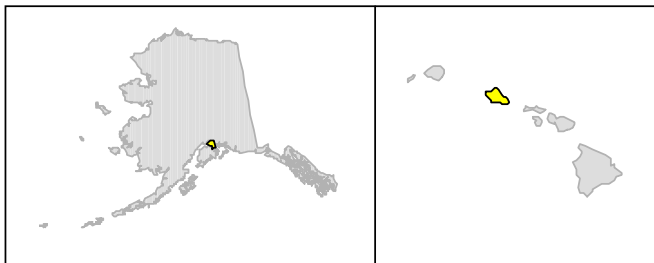
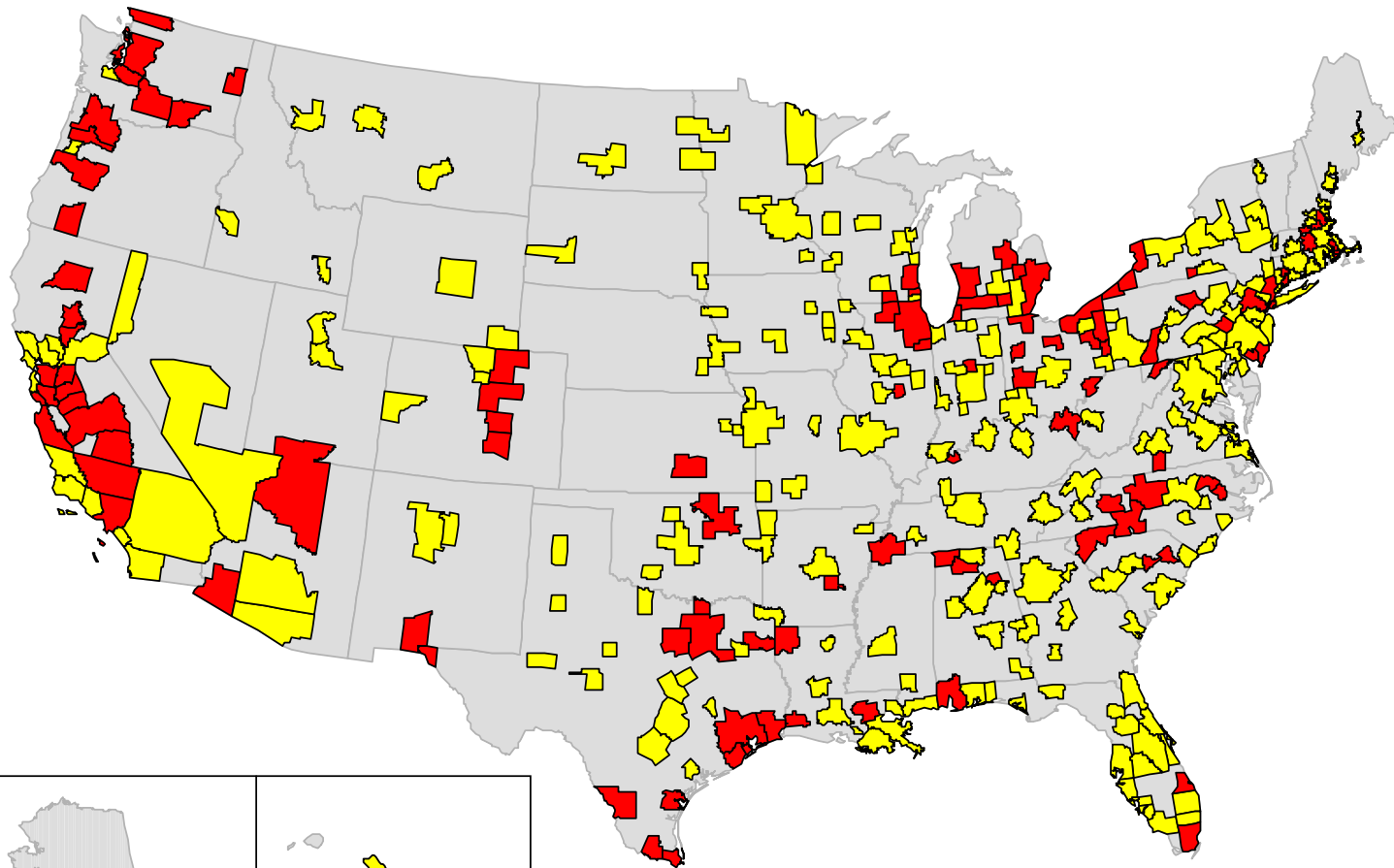
