PORTLAND-SALEM CONSUMER PRICES UP 1.8 PERCENT IN THE FIRST HALF OF 2004—2.0 PERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO

Consumer prices in the Portland metropolitan area rose 1.8 percent in the first half of 2004 and 2.0 percent from one year prior, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor. Regional Commissioner Richard J. Holden said that rising transportation prices, followed by housing prices, were largely responsible for the overall six month increase. For the year, however, food and beverages was the major contributor to the increase in Portland's consumer basket of goods.

The overall transportation index moved up 2.9 percent in the first half of 2004 and rose 3.4 percent for the past 12 months. Average gasoline pump prices jumped 14.6 percent in the first six months of 2004, driving the overall increase in the transportation index. Compared to a year ago, Portland drivers' gasoline prices have increased 14.0 percent.

The overall housing index increased 1.0 percent during the first half of 2004, after remaining essentially unchanged during the second half of 2003. Over the past six months, the shelter component of housing moved upwards by 0.7 percent. In the same period, household furnishings and operations prices were up 1.3 percent. Also for the first half of 2004, fuels and utilities prices increased 2.2 percent; with utility (piped) gas service outpacing electricity rates, 3.2 and 1.6 percent, respectively. Compared to a year ago, shelter increased 0.9 percent, fuels and utilities increased 3.6 percent, and household furnishings and operations prices fell 0.4 percent.

Prices for food and beverages rose 2.9 percent in the first half of 2004. Grocery prices, as represented by the food at home index, increased 3.7 percent, while the price of food away from home increased 2.1 percent. Prices paid for alcoholic beverages in the first half of 2004 rose 1.2 percent. For the past 12 months, the food and beverage index rose 4.1 percent, the largest increase since the first half of 1998. The food at home and food away from home indexes rose by 5.3 and 3.2 percent, respectively, compared to a year ago.

Prices for education and communication rose by 1.1 percent during the first half of 2004. For the 12 month period, the education and communication index advanced 3.1 percent, the largest one-year increase for this category since the 1998 CPI revision.

The miscellaneous other goods and services index advanced 0.8 percent in the past six months, and 1.3 percent over the year.

Medical care prices increased 2.6 percent since the second half of 2003. Compared to a year ago, medical care prices advanced 2.8 percent.

The recreation index increased 1.8 percent in the past six months, following a 0.4 percent six month decrease in the second half of 2003. For the year, recreation prices measured 1.4 percent higher.

Apparel prices rose 3.0 percent in the first half of 2004. However, average apparel prices measured 1.0 percent lower for the latest twelve month period.

The area's Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) advanced to 189.8 (1982-84=100) during the first half of 2004. This means a market basket of goods and services that cost \$100.00 in 1982-84 would have cost \$189.80 during the past six months. Local area CPI data are not seasonally adjusted.
