APPENDIX 1001(g)

Local Regulations of Chief Judge Donald R. Sharp

These local regulations supplement and expand the Local Rules of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of Texas in regulating the procedures for handling cases assigned to Chief Judge Donald R. Sharp. To the extent they modify and expand the Local Rules, they have the same force and affect as Local Rules.

Regulation 3007

Omnibus claims objections to groups of claims are not allowed. Each claims objection must deal with one specific claim.

No response is required by the creditor to a claims objection. Claims objections are set on the Court's docket on not less than 30 days notice and upon the hearing date if the claimant does not appear, the Court will normally sustain the objection without requiring evidence. If the objecting party does not appear, the Court will dismiss the claims objection for failure to prosecute.

Regulation 7056

Upon receipt of a motion for summary judgment, the clerk shall set a hearing thereon on not less than 30 days notice to the movant and respondent. All parties are specifically excused from any appearance at the scheduled hearing unless the Court specifically requests their appearance for oral argument. Either party is free to request oral argument prior to the hearing. If no specific request for appearance is made or allowed by the Court, the summary judgment shall be disposed of on the hearing date or shall be taken under advisement by the Court.
