EARLY LEARNING OPPORTUNITY ACT GRANTEES

Twenty-six Early Learning Opportunity Act (ELOA) grants have been awarded for FY 2001. Listed below is summary information including the grantee and project title/description for each of the ELOA grants. Communities in 18 States, including one Tribe and one Alaskan Native Corporation, received grants ranging from \$246,380 to \$1 million. Most of the grantees will implement strategies to improve early learning through parent education, provider training and professional development, and better linkages among service providers within local communities. Several grantees propose to establish better connections between health and child care programs. Others plan to expand the availability of care for special populations including infants and toddlers, children with special needs, and families that require non-standard hour care.
