COMDENING THE BURDER OF W. E. "BILL" SMITH.

JOHN BLARDMORE, Fairfax, Oklahoma. This men is a white man and was interviewed under cover by this agent. He states that day before the home of Bill Salvi was blown up that SMITH told him; BEARMMORE, that he expected to be murdered at any time, as he, SMITH, had just met BILL HALE on the road near Fairfax and Hale drew his six shooter on him, saying to SMITH, "You G-D-S- of a B-if I hear you talking about these Indian murders, I will send you to hell." BEARMMORE a close friend of BILL SMITH, the murdered man, and is all right. His occupation is a laboring man, an at the present time he lives in rairfax, Oklahoma. BEARMMORE further stated that MMITH had moved in his, SMITH'S, home the same day he was blown up.

GEORGE BOLTON, Fairfax, Oklahoma. He is a white men and said to be A. K. and against the Hall AND SUPPLIEST factions. At one time Hall had an affair with BOLTON'S sister, this being sometime past. BOLTON is a son-in-law of I. R. HEDGES, who lives at Halston, Oklahoma. HEDGES is an important witness in the ARKI RECORD murder case.

EMILL BOLTON lives on a ranch near rairfax, Oklahoma. He is a white man and married to an Indian squaw. He is a brother of GLORGE BOLTON and a close friend of ARMADT and BRYAN SURPHART. It is known by this agent that KRNADT and BRYAN BURNHART. It is known by this agent that KRNADT and BRYAN BURNHART. It is known by this agent that KRNADT and BRYAN BURNHART have confided in or with administrate BOLTON on several occasions with reference to the Indian marders, even admitting to him in their drunken spress that they were implicated with the Indian marders. ARMADT BOLTON possibly heard BILL HALK say that for 100.00 he, HALE, could get any set of a Bendunged off in Case County. MR. BOLTON is the son of CHRIS BOLTON, who is an old timer around Mairfax. His father is very friendly to the Government while ARMADT, his son, is believed by this addit will tell the truth about what he knows regarding the statements of BILL HALK and ARMADT and BRYAN BUNNEART when he, BOLTON, is put on the witness stand. It is suggested by this agent that ARMADT BULKHART are in custody, he should be interviewed, and subposened to appear as a Government witness whenever this case is presented for prosecution.

W. U. COPELAND, Pairfax, Oxlahoma. He is a white man and sat on the Coroner's Jury after BILL SMITH, his wife and their servant girl were blown up at rairfax. His occupation is a banker, being assistant Jashier of the first National Bank. He is no good and is a close friend of BILL H.L. and does business with the BILL HALL does business at the first Lational Bank.

bick CRABBELL, Pairtai, Oxlanoma. He is a white man and is said to have heard the death bed statement of BILL MITH. His occupation is a plumber and he is said to be all right by under cover men.

JIM KASTLE, rairfex, Oklahoma. He is a white man, aquaw men and a brother-in-law to BRYAN SURNARY. He is said by confidential informants to know a good deal about the Indian murders, especially the blowing up of the SMITH home, as well as the HARY AGAN and ANA BROWN murders.

w. G. LYNN, Fairrel, Okla. He is a white man and is a witness in the BILL SMITH murder case. He is thoroughly trust worthy and is a good citizen. In also sat on the Coroner's Jury. MR. LYNN is the Guardian of BRYAK BURKHART'S wife, who is an Indian women, her name being MODA Labley BURKHART. MR. LYNN is an important witness in the u. s. (Bill) SLITE murder case and after the apprehension BILL Halk, KREET AND DRYAK BURKHART, will be needed by the agents of the Bureau when HODA, BRYAN BURKHART'S wife naturally will come to MR. LYNN for assistance. This matter is to be considered very confidential.

SID DELPLANE, former Unier of Police of Ponca City and is now living in Ponca City, Okla. He is a white man and a witness said to have a lot of general information. From the reports of complicantial informants this man is very doubtful and he associates with the HALE and BURKHART gang.

He is reported by one of the confidential informants to be all right and will tell the truth when he is put on the witness stand, but other larger mants report that he will be handled by Halk if Halk is brought up for prosecution.

BILL PHYOH, Grayhorse, Oklahoma. He is a white men and is said to be a witness and can give considerable general information. There is no such man as J. PHYOH, but there is a BILL PHYOH living at Grayhorse and is O. K., if he is the same man mentioned in previous reports as J. PHYOH.

M. M. HIJHELDIN. Indian agent, rairfax, takle. He is a white man and close friend of BILL Hale, and wears suits of clothes purchased by Hale. He is no good, crocked and will do what BILL Hale says to do. This man is a taylete and is said to be the party who is putting out information obtained through the Indian office at Pawhuska, Oklahoma. He is said to be a constant companion of BILL Hale and will help him when he and his gang are brought up for presecution.

SHARLES ROLF, FRIFAX, Oklahoma. He is a white man and was county attorney at the time of the BILL shiff murder. He is no good, crooked and a clear friend of BILL H.Lb. He is listed in previous reports as Ma. ROTH, but there is no such man as MR. HOLH living in Osage Sounty. MR. HOLF testified at the Coroner's Jury held after the skill murder.

FRED HOME, Pawhuska, Okla. He is a white man and his occupation is now man. He is reported by confidential informants to be a strong Halm man and a very close friend of BILL Hala.

BILL DEAR, rairfax, Okla. He is a white man, good citizen and bears a good reputation. As to giving out facts with reference to indian lurders it is said he knows some masts regarding the blowing up of the BILL DEITH home.

FRANK TRANSILL, Pawhneks, Okla. He is a white man and is mentioned in previous reports as witness of the aMITH murder case. This man is said to know facts regarding the aMITH murder case. He is planning, according to reports, to go to Mexico.

HENRY MERD, Prinfar, Okla. He is a white man and is agent for Jewett automobiles. He is now reported to be absolutely 0. K. and is a bitter enemy of BILL HALE and his gang and has quite a lot of general information. He stated to this agent that if subpossed and brought before the Court that he would tell all he knows and more too. WARD has been very useful and has helped this agent considerable in this investigation of Indian markers heretofore mentioned, in fact this agent knew WARD's relatives when they lived in Hayes, Blanco and Lano Counties, Texas.

L. A. WINNYER and not J. G. WINNEYAR, Fairfax, Okla. He is a white man and a brother-in-law of HOMER HUTTAKIN, who is a strong HALE man and also a banker being connected with the First Lational Bank of Fairfax, Oklahoma. WINNEYER is in favor of the Government and is a litter enemy of BILL HALE. He is a witness in this case on general information and he is now in Idaho on a hunting trip, but will return shortly to his home in Fairfax.

PRAIR GIRLER, Fairfal, Ohla. He is a white man, ex-boot legger and his occupation is that of a carpenter. He talks considerable around town in better and pobl halls. He stated that BILL Hall has and will run off several witnesses. GIRLERR claims to know all about the SKITH home being blown up. This man at the proper time should be interviewed by an agent of the Bureau and if what he claims is

true, a subpoena should be issued for him to testify before the Grand Jury.

DR. ALEXANDER MEMAY, Fairfax, Okla. Chiropractor. He is a white men and is now making efforts to get information with reference to the Government on the investigations of Indian margers and is turning said information over to BILL HALE. He is a close friend of BILL HALE, Hale being a patient of his, as well as an note for a good amount of money at the First National Bank of Pairiax, Okla.

PHILIP RELD, Fouraker, Okla. He is a white man and he will be a witness for the HALE faction and is a close friend and also a former pardner of BILL HALE when HALE insured his grass for 30,000 and later having it burned and collecting the insurance. This man will be a character witness for BILL HALE and said to swear to anything HALE will want him to swear to when HALE is brought up for prosecution.

made a statement to agent J. A. STARLT at the Phoenia, arizona, Sureau office at which time he told MR. STARLT he was going to move to Janyon Bity, Jolos, within a short time. He is now back in Osage County living at Pawhuska, Oklas This was reported by confidential informants to be a Halk man and probably will be a witness for Halk and the BURKHARTS in case they are brought up for prosecution. This man came back to Osage County from arizona with the idea of trying to get in the service of the Indian agency with the purpose of running down the markerers of the Osage Incians, but is merely wanting to get into the service of the Indian Department for the salary, only expecting to do little or no work towards solving the Geage Indian markers.

Following are the cow boys of BILL Hale, who will probably be witnesses for him. They are all white men:

BRETT COVERT, FRITTER, Okla. He has been with Half about six or eight months.

SAM DOMALDOM, reinfal, Okla. He has been with Hill about two years.

MR. BERGER, Fairfax, Okla. He has been with BILL HALE about three or four years and with L. L. OLLER, Hale's pardner.

JIM LYMM, Fairfal, Okla. He has been with BILL Hall about six months and leases his grass to Hall. He is not related to will LYMM.

JON BOWERT, FRITZER, Okla. He has been with DILL Hall about one year and is a strong Halk man.

HILE. They are in business together.

OTHER CLOSE FRIENDS OF HELE:

BRIGHT HODDY, Prwhisks, Okla. He owns a furniture store and is a look out man for BILL Halk and after the BILL BLITH home was blown up. He is a murderer and a close friend bill Hill and will assist Halk if possible but it is reported to this agent by considerable informants that when this man is put on the witness stand that he is be compelled to tell the truth, regarding the Indian murders, and it is further stated that this man knows considerable with reference to Osage Indian murders in Osage County, Oklahoma. This man is and of late he has been visiting rairfax and has been in close communication with BILL Halk on several occasions.

with H. G. BU.C. He has lately been visting Fairfax and conferring with BILL Halk and his friends. It is said that SHTH LEWIS will favor HALK in his trouble and will assist him in every way possible, when HALE is brought before the Cause. Lawis at the present time is under indictment in the rederal Sourt of Oklahoma on viblation of the narcotic laws.

GEORGE MEDDERS, Deming, N. M. For the past six months up until very recently MEDDERS has been employed by w. A. ADAMS, who lives at 3104 Pershing Mrive, El Paso, Pexas, as a cow here taking care of cattle owned by MR. AIRMS and pastured by BILL Halk in his pasture near and in the wickity of Mairfax, Okla. MEDDERS at the proper time should be interviewed by an Agent of this Bureau, as it is reported by considertial informants that MEDDERS has heard some conversation from HALE as well as HALE'S cowboys with reference to the Indian Murders of Osage County, Okla. MEDDERS will lie if given a chance as he naturally favors the HALE faction.

is guilty. He and Halk have been closely associated together for the past six or eight months, that is by Halk pasturing alaky's cattle and helping him make large sales of same. Auring this year, 1925, Halk has pastured about 3000 head of cattle for MR. AMANS. It is said by considential informants that AMANS will assist HALK if he is prosecuted by advising him, Hald, to get a certain firm of lawyers living at Pt. Borth, Pexas, to defend him. Hames of lawyers unknown, but this information can be secured at a later date. Adams if subpoened and brought into Jourt will have to tell what he knows about Halk's talk to him with reference to the Osage Indian murders. It is a known fact that adams advised Halk's detective and spy, JIK NOSE, gave him names of some of the Jovernment agents, who were investigating the Osage Indian margers. Adams did give adams help at first when agent went to hairfax, but was given to understand that Halk did or should know that this agent was a Jovernment agent, after adams stated that he could not believe Halk could do such a thing, that is having a home blown up.

BILL HALE and H. J. BURT. He will assist BILL Halk in case that he is prosecute for the Indian murders of Osage County. Dall TURNER will in all probability will be a witness for Hale and his faction.

BUCK ELDREDGE, now living at Guthrie, Okla. He is a white man and is now in the employ of the HALE fection making efforts at Guthrie to find out just what the Jovernment is going to do in regard to the HALE faction or in regard to the HaLE investigation. He is making inquiries of different citizens living in Guthria as to when Court meets etc. It has been stated to this agent that ELDREGGE is probably figuring on who will be on the Jury and will, if possible, try to fix the Jury or get someone on the Jury, who would favor the HALE faction in case prosectulon is brought by the Jovernment.

MR PRICE, first name unknown. Address unknown but now residing at Guthrie. Oxia. He is a white man and is also under the employ of HALE and is making inquiries as to who the different Government agents are and what their business is in Fringer, as well as the Osage Jountry. He is posing as a cow man. This party is stopping at the Ione Hotel and is accompanied by a short heavy set American, whose name is unknown but will be ascertained at a later date. These two men are closely associated with BULK Limitude.

MCY 300M is a white man and was a telephone operator at malston, Okla., at the time the ... B. Smith home was blown up, and whose present whereabouts are unknown. He stated that a man who said his name was Kelsie Morrison put in a telephone for BILL Halm after the explosion and later talked with party and told him everything was all right and for him to come in. The above information came to me thru MR. E. K. PIKE.

L. L. OLLER, Fairfar, Okla. He is a white man and his occupation is that of a cow men. He is associated with HALE in grazing interests. Ascently his son, williand Ollen, was arrested at Pawhisks and charged with cow theft, as well as theft of mules. At first L. L. OLLER, father of wILLER, was very bitter in his denunciation of BILL M.LE, because H.LE, his pardner, took an active part in the prosection of OLLER'S son, wILLERD. WILLERD OLLER is charged in the District Court of Casge County with theft of certain cattle and mules belonging to different persons, males in particularly belonging to GEORGE BULTON. Following are names of mon, who are charged jointly with theit of cattle and mules with WILLIAM OLLER: DERT THOMAS, L. BORRIL, REYMOND COVERT and JOHN CARROLL. Recently BILL Halk and L. L. Oller have buried the hatenet and it is reported by confidential informants that Halm will endeavor now to assist "ILLARD OLLER, L. L. OLLER's son, to get out of trouble. However, L. L. OLLER has demanded from HALE a division of property. Half in the end will favor OLLER'S son and out trade OLLER in the division of the property, which is owned by him and HALE. This agreement as reported by considential informents is that JIM MODO and others brought Hall and OLLER together and got them to agree on certain terms, as L. L. OLLER was gunning for Halm at a previous time or at the time CLLER'S son, allLard, was arrested for cow and mule theft. GUOTGE BULTON was requested not to press the prosecution against young GLIER for the theft of his, solfon's cattle and stock.

sand Government suctioneer. This man is not know to this agent but is reported by an under cover informent to have sail recently, that he did not believe that sail HALE was guilty of anything wrong in the Osage country. That he, an LTERE, was sure of that. That he has been in business and has sold a number of leases as well

as live stock for the Government and the Indians for a long time and was well acquainted with BILL HALE, and that the investigation made of BILL HALE, if there was any was a mistake. This man further stated to confidential informant that he had been anemployee of the pepartment of Justice and had a badge on, which said was given to him by the Indians for his services and square dealings, which he now wears. Confidential informant further stated that above the badge had he, WALTERS, were and connected with it was the words Department of Justice. It is not know either this man was trying to seek information from the confidential informant or really meant what he said. However, he stated to confidential informant that the lovernment had some new information regarding the Osage Indian marders, which in no way showed HALE was commented with the indian surders.

Of a peddler of women's silk clothes etc. MENDON has resided in wairfax and vicinity for the past twenty years. He is well acquainted with the citizens of rairiax. It is reported by continential informants that MENDOR could give some information regarding the Indian miraers. MENDOR has not been interviewed by an agent of the bureau, but this agent under cover talked to him on several occasions but it is my belief that MENDOR can give valuable information regarding the Indian trouble of Osage Jounty, Oklahom. MENDOR resides at the Francis Hotel when in sairiax, but most of the time he is out among the people selling his goods. He is said to be a good man.

FRANK aballs, Pairfax, Okla. He is a white man and his occupation is that of a tailor. He has made bill Hall's clothes for several years. Confidential informants report that this man probably knows some facts regarding some of Milk's activities in any around rairfax. Applie has not yet been interviewed but at the proper time an agent of this Sureau will interview him.

MARY EVANS, Feirfax, Okla. She is a white woman and lived near the house of BILL SMITH the night or morning of the explosion. She is a close friend of BILL Hale, in fact Hale got her to marry at one time an Osage Indian by the name of DON SIGNERLON for the purpose of getting the Indian's money. She is no good and is a sporting woman, and is a strong Hale supporter and will help Hale and his faction in case they are brought up for presecution.

5. M. SMITH knows as SOL SMITH, Fairfax, Okla. He is a white man and his occupation is ranchman and cattle owner and very wealthy. He is now very friendly to BILL Halm. Recently BILL Halm visited SOL SMITH when he was in the hospital at rairial where he was recovering from an operation for appendicitis. It was previously reported that SOL SMITH and BILL Halm had a big falling out over SOL SMITH'S wife, but it is a fact that SOL SMITH and his wife had not lived together for quite swhile. SOL SMITH in all probability will be an important witness for BILL Halm in case he or his gang are brought up for prosecution.

The following men are look out and spys for BILL HALK and his faction:

MR. LET BOLION living near rairiax, Okla. He is a white man and a square man, who is continually associated with male. T and Bayak BURKHART and can, it made to tell, give information regarding mREEST and BRYAK BURKHART'S connection with all a BROWN and other Indian margers.

MRD. NORA BERNA, Barthesville, orla. She is a white woman, who is mentioned in previous reports and knows facts concerning movements of ARMA BROWN at the time of the ARMA BROWN murder. She is a woman of bad repute and is one of HALK'S personal friends.

MARY BLESKEIRD, Grayhorse, Oxla. She is an Indian woman and is reported by considential informents to be close friend of BILL Halk and can be handled by Halk and BURKHARD in case they are brought up for prosectuion, but if pressure is brought to bear siter the arrest of Halk and the BURKHARD, it is believed that she can be made to tell the truth, as she is reported in previous reports to know some facts conserving the marder of the Indian woman, AND BRO E.

BOB SHROFE, rairtal, Okla. He is a white man and is said to be a look out for BILL Half and partly raised by blad Half. If used as a witness for Half, he will make a good one for the Half and BURKHART faction. He is very sharp and evidently from reports of confidential informants will assist Half and the BURKHART if they are brought to justice.

mDITH MEVIS, 40 N. Yorktovn St., Pulsa, Ukla. She is a white woman and former maid for all a BRC.N. She is reported by confidential informants to be a woman or shady character and will be for the SUAKHART and Halm faction when the show down comes.

I. R. Haugan, malston, Okla. He is a white man and is said to have seem BRYAK BURKHART and AND ENOUNK together on the night of the murder. He is reported by confidential informants to be a good man. He is the father-in-law of GEORGE BOLLTON, GEORGE ECLIFON being mentioned as a likely witness in the Osage Indian markets

This man worked for half on many occasions to feed worked for Hals hauling cotton seed cake etc for half on many occasions to feed cattle. This man is doubtful and should be watched, and kept under observation when Halk and sunkingly are brought up for trial.

ALGGIS JLAG MOJURE, Indian woman now living with any BUNUH and his wife, formerly the wife of HERRY AUAH, deceased. One is working as a servent and reported in previous reports that she saw BRYAN BUNKFART and ARNA BROWN leave ARNA BROWN home on the night of the marder and reported by J. M. JROSSIAND to know some facts concerning the marder of ARNA BROWN. She is a woman who is now drinking lots of liquor and is absolutely afraid of the HALE and BUNKHART faction. WH. JROSSIAND states positively that this woman knows a good deal concerning the marder of ARNA BROWN. Investigation will be made and the party interviewed at the proper time.

D. Halkey, maiston, Okla. He is a white man and reported previously as a. D. Halkey, who is said to have seen able Brown and Brown Burkhard in maiston on the night of the marter. He is a strong Halm and Burkhard man, and will assist them in their trouble and is a very close friend to Halm as well as Bryan and arbital Burkhard.

MRS. ANTHOLITERLY, rainfal, okla. She is a white woman and reported by considential informants to be all right. The is a married toman and lived near ANTA SHE I and is reported to have cooked the last most in the evening before ANTA pROWN was margared.

MELVIN CASE, rairfar, Okla. He is a white man, squaw man and in the cow business. He is friendly to the Government and lived adjoining neighbor to ARKA BROWN and the house that ARIA browned is now owned by MILL HALM and he and his family are living there at the present time. In. Jahn will be very useful and will help the covernment in case the prosecution is brought against the BUMMIARTS and Halm. This man has not yet been interviewed by an agent of this Bureau as to any positive facts, but it is believed by this agent that when the proper time comes. UR. CASE can give some very material evidence. He is a little skittish, in fact his Indian wife was almost a nervous wreck after the reign of terror and CASE had to take her away from rairfax for while after the Indian marders.

KR. TURTER, Arkenses City, Kans. He is with the Mirkpatrick Aurniture Company, but formerly of Pairfax, Okla. He was an undertaker at Pairfax at the time of the Indian markers and menuled and prepared the body of Alka BROWN, as well as the different ones, and while there worked as undertaker for the Big Hill Trading Company, which is controlled by Hale, SCOTT HATRID and HONER HUFFARED SCOTT MATRIS fired TURTER from the Big Hill Trading Company. MR. TURTER is absolutely all right and bitterly hates the Hale gang and will testify in behalf of the

Government if this case is brought up for prosecution.

CONCERNING THE MURDER OF HEARY ROLL.

JOHN FIBRY, Oklahoma City, Okla. He is a waite was and representation.
Insurance Company in the BILL HALE suit against the Insurance Company to redove insurance on HENRY ROAN. This agent was asked by the Bureau to get MR. EMBRY Stirst name, which is JOHN.

MALIE FLETCHER, Pawhuska, Okla. She is an Osage Indian woman and is said to know some facts concerning the ROAN murder. She is a woman of very little concerning and can not be depended on.

E. M. PIKE, formerly Kansas City, Mo., new Pairfax, Oklassific is a white man and a former private detective and sais to be in the employ of the interior Department working under J. GLORGE MRIGHT, Indian Agent, located at Pawhuska. Oklahoma. It is reported by confidential informants that RIKE knows considerable about the HIMRY ROAD murder as well as the ARMA BROWN murder. This agent has met PIKE but at this time cannot state positively how PIKE is getting along, but apparently he is doing the best he can. We has been sick lately and reports that it is just a waiting game with him. It is reported by confidential informants to this Agent that PIKE tells some of the residents of Pairfax that nothing more can be done with reference to the investigation of the Indian murders of Osage County, and that the case is at its end, and ot others he states that the parties. HALE and the BURKSARTs, will be brought to justice and will be prosecuted in a short time. MR. PIKE is living with his wife and child at the PRANCIS Hetal and from (128) his talks to this agent and his connection with the Interior Department under J. GEORGE WRIGHT we will have to trust him in these investigations, that is he is there for a certain purpose hoping that Hall, so he states, may offer him a bribe and if he is offered a bribe he will immediately advise the Bureau and bring in other witnesses to co-operate the bribery of Eals, if such a thing happens.

Manager of Bar Pool Hall. From confidential sources the following information was obtained: ROY BUNCH came to RARGER and showed him a pistol and wanted him, BARGER, to keep it for him, saying 'Just like for you to keep this pistol, I am afraid that I will get into trouble about it if I keep it myself." This occurrence was a short time before HARRY ROAK, Osage Indian's body was found. Confidential informants further state that there was only two pistols like the one in Osage County that how BUNCH wanted marger to keep for him. This statement was made by BARGER to JOHN LYMM, son of MARL LYMM. JOHN LYMM is now in Manages attending school Studying law. His father and mother reside at rairfax and are good people. ARCH BARGER is considered a good white man.

This agent was introduced to EILL HALE about Aug. 16th at the Smith-Williams Hetel in rairfax, Oklahoms, HALE'S TO.N. Since that time from time time this agent has met BILL HALE and H.L. has been very telkative with reference to his cattle deals and his boyhood days, how he r.n away from home and became cowboy. He has a very high opinion of himself and is money med, as well as more crait

He has stated to agent at different times that he is suffering with stomach trouble. and lately has also stated to this agent that he has been unable to get any sleep or rest for nearly a month. He is very nervous and has further stated to this agent that he has sold out all of his cattle interests, which has been verified, and has only about 250 head or cattle on hand, as well as about 75 tons of cotton seed he does not know just what he is going to do, but he thinks he needs a long He has been very triendly to this agent, in fact has introduced me to quite number of the citizens of sairfax, Oklahoma, and from further investigation he now making all the propagands he can to favor himself by giving presents, saite clothes, as well as going on notes for different people of rairfax, and giving ponies away to young boys and being kind to those who are afflicted, as well as to old people. Of late he has not been coming down tone as might and through warmen his tailor ne has ordered a suit of clothes as well as an overcoat, and states to his tailor that he is going to make a trip to Florida. His daughter, a young girl about eighteen years old, has stated to the wife of a confidential informat, that were they have everything passed and are ready to go at a moment's notice, and that there is another woman trying to get her pape and she and her mother are very much worried about this. It is not probable that BILL HALB will flee to another country but this agent is not able at this time to state the exact plans of BILL MIR." has stated on one occasion, in the presence of this Agent, to others, that he is too slick on keen to catch cold, and was tired of two bit crooks riding the public on his reputation. This was in a conversation with reference to the cow theft of WILLARD OLLER, son of Hall'to perdner, L. L. OLLER, and WILLARD'S associates mentioned he etorore. Halk is : very bitter in his demunciation of the K. K. K. and cusses them openly on the streets of rairfax, but his close bosom friend, PITTS BRATY is a high member of the E. K. K. located at rairfax and is continually giving him information as well as assisting him, HAME, in all of his crooked deals.

FITTS Boaty is a man about mifty years old and has had considerable experience in the cow man game. He is an arch trickster and will resort to most anything to help out MALE and his gang in case they are brought to justice. MAS PITTS Boaty, the wife of subject, Boaty, is a very nervous and weak woman and is almost on the verge of hysterics for fear that her husband will be brought into some trouble by Hale and his gang.

that Hale will take her to riorida or some other resort to let her recuperate. Hale controls the majority of the citizens of rairfax by his methods, and is closely allied with the big interests of Osage County, and will resort to most any trickery to gain his point or his freedom if brought to justice. At this time Hale has made about 75,000 in now business as well as other matters in this year, 1925. Hale is a 32nd degree lason and has assisted several of his friends in getting into the lasons, as well as putting them through to higher degrees. Hale at this time knows that this agent is in the employ of the Jovernment and is connected with the investigation investigation. Agent will continue to do the best that he can on this investigation reporting facts obtained during his stay in Osage County.

Occupation is that of a poker player and he handles liquor. He is a nephron at MAME and in all probability will be one of the defendants in the Indian murder.

He is a very nervous man and from appearances and inquiries that he has been making among the different ones of mirrax, he expects something to happen regarding his activities in the Indian marders. No doubt when this man is apprehended he can be easily broken down by the agents of the Eureau and made to tell the truth concerning his connection with the Indian marders. This is also the opinion of confidential informants working in connection with this agent at rairiax and vicinity.

BRYAN BURKHART, Fairfax, Okla. He is a white was and is married to managed in the squaw, her name being BOUE Lablay Burkhart. BRYAN BURKHART in all probability will be one of the defendants in the Indian marder cases. He is a nephew of BILL HALK and a brother of ERNEST BURKHART. He is some younger than ERNEST, his brother, and from actions and his inquiries amon, his friends with reference to investigation being made at this time by the agents of the Bureau, he is not so much worried as his brother, ERNEST, and is a different type of man from his brother. He is more reserved, smeaking and till hear things to himself and it will be hard for him to be made to tell the truth in his connection with his Uncle, BILL Halk, and his brother, ERNEST SUMMARY, in their complicity in the Indian markers som itted in the past in Usage Jounty, Joklahoma.

HORACE BURNIANT is a brother to ERREST and BRYAE BURNEART, and also a nephew of BILL Hala. He is a different type of man in comparison to all the other three, his Uncle, BILL Hala, and his to brothers, arkast and BRYAE BURNEART. At the present time he is living ten or twelve miles northeast of rairfax, Okla., and is in partnership with his Uncle, BILL Hala. They own some steers together. This party very seldom comes to town and does not seem to associate with his brothers at rairfax when he does visit this city, and in no way goes he take any part in the power games and the bootlegging operations of his two prothers, and Sayah colling. He, however, will do just what his Uncle, slab hala, tells him to do in the event that his brothers and his Uncle are brought up for prosectaion in connection with the indian marders.

BILL Mall recently has had a talk with LEARLY, MDDOWLED and riled, attorneys, located at Fawhusks, Oxiahome, with reference to the probability of his being proceduted in the reserval boart about the indian marker cases, and in all probability has given this firm an attorney see, and it is said by confidential informants that they will represent Male and his faction in case they are brought into rederal boart. Further Male has also employed GAIMSTALD, SCOTT and HAMILTON at lathuant to desend him in case he is prosecuted for the indian markers of Caspe lounty, Oxiahome. This information is considered correct as it was secured from clients of the above mentioned law firms, the clients being very friendly to the povernment.



This information has been secured since I mailed these abstracts to you and has reference to the W. E. (Bill) Smith case, as well as the henry hoan and anna Brown cases. I have had memorandums attached to each of these sheets showing just how to file them in the one that you have.




