National Security Course Now Accepting Applications


The Navy is accepting applications from unrestricted line captains and captain-selects for the 2005 National Security Management Course at the Maxwell School, Syracuse University until Sept. 30.

The six-week course focuses on various aspects of national security policy, including how political, economic and social forces influence decisions within the Department of Defense.

Applicants must be top-performing unrestricted line captains or captain-selects with a proven track record of management and superior performance, and will hold a master's degree or proven subspecialties. Selected applicants will incur an additional two years obligated service upon completion of the course.

The course, which will be held in the spring of 2005, is designed for senior officials in national security at the government's General Service Management (GS/GM) level of GS/GM-15 or above, and active-duty officers O-6 and above.
