NOAA TO JOIN FEDERAL AND CARIBBEAN PARTNERS IN WHITE WATER TO BLUE WATER CONFERENCE

Miami Conference Aims to Unite Efforts to Protect Caribbean Ecosystems

Over 600 representatives from 31 countries of the wider Caribbean region and other coastal nations, the travel and tourism industry, academia, international organizations, the private sector and environmental groups will meet at the White Water to Blue Water (WW2BW) conference in Miami, March 22-26. The conference is designed to forge partnerships that safeguard the Caribbean's marine and coastal ecosystems. Participants will also spend the week attending workshops that cover topics such as managing oil spills, fighting coral diseases, environmentally sound marine transportation, and instituting a reef-friendly mooring buoy program.

The conference, sponsored by the United States government, kicks off the White Water to Blue Water Partnership, an initiative announced at the World Summit on Sustainable Development in 2002. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is an agency of the U.S. Department of Commerce.
