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DLA Affirms Distribution Depot A-76 Competition Results

Fort Belvoir, Va. -- The Defense Logistics Agency announced today the final decision on the public-private competition for performance of distribution operations at Defense Distribution Depot Tobyhanna, Pa. A tentative decision was announced June 4 that operations and management of its Defense Distribution Depot Tobyhanna, Pa., would remain in-house rather than be contracted to a private company.

The depot, with its work force of career federal employees, will streamline and reduce the costs of the receipt, store and issue mission.

The DLA Administrative Appeal Authority received no appeals of the tentative decision. The public review period to submit appeals began June 4 and closed July 7.

To be eligible for consideration, an appeal must identify noncompliance with requirements and procedures set forth in OMB Circular A-76, the guidance governing the public-private competition, or specific items entered on the cost comparison form.

The transition period from current operations to the government's Most Efficient Organization structure is scheduled to take approximately 180 days following the date of the tentative cost comparison decision. The projected five-year net savings is \$12 million, or a 40 percent reduction of the costs associated with the distribution functions currently performed at DDTP.

Defense Distribution Depot Tobyhanna is a field activity of the Defense Distribution Center, New Cumberland, Pa.
