ePME is an enterprise-wide solution that enables effective R&D management, tracking, and reporting throughout the Department and is a critical component of the Department's E-Government strategy in response to the President's Management Agenda. ePME includes:

- business process re-engineering;
- implementation of information technology coupled with business rules to support the processes; and
- and integration with other key corporate systems and E-Government initiatives (e.g. I-MANAGE, E-Grants, etc.).

ePME addresses the whole R&D project management lifecycle from the receipt of proposals to the completion of projects, supports comprehensive portfolio management, and facilitates strategic investment decisions. In addition, ePME enables Departmental R&D portfolio reporting with significantly greater efficiency, consistency, and timeliness for both internal and external constituents. Finally, ePME reduces the administrative reporting burden on performing sites.

Accomplishments

- Completion of three regional *Requirements Workshops* and a *Requirements Validation Meeting* for the first ePME module related to electronic receipt of proposals from national laboratories for new *and ongoing* R&D projects. (*Fifty-six key subject experts in program management; budget, accounting, and finance; and information technology from across the complex participated).*
- Completion of the *business process re-engineering effort* for the ePME sub-module related to receipt and review of new proposals from national laboratories. (*Twenty-eight subject matter experts from 19 different organizations participated.*)
- Completion of an ePME concept paper, vetted through all of the Program Secretarial Offices having major R&D efforts, for the second ePME module related to R&D portfolio management, tracking, and reporting. The ePME concept paper will drive

the business process re-engineering and requirements activities for the second ePME module.

- Renewed formal collaboration processes with other key corporate systems and E-Government initiatives to reflect changes from external drivers.

Critical Policy Decisions

The ePME will continue as a separate project from I-MANAGE under the current ePME project organization; however, the I-MANAGE and ePME Executive Steering Committees will be merged.

Project Status

- The first ePME module, pertaining to electronic receipt of laboratory field work proposals for new and ongoing projects, is proceeding as planned. The sub-module pertaining to grants has been postponed and is being coordinated and scheduled to align with the Department's Streamlining the Departmental Grants Processing initiative and the federal Grants.gov effort.
- The schedule for the second ePME module, pertaining to portfolio management, tracking, and reporting is being accelerated to better align with the I-MANAGE schedule.
- The overall project schedule and cost is being rebaselined to reflect changes driven by the President's Management Agenda and E-Government.
- An updated Exhibit 300 is being prepared for the FY 05 budget submission to reflect changes.

- An Executive Steering Committee Meeting is being schedule for early July.
- A Communications and Outreach Teleconference is being scheduled for mid-July.
