Update on NDPA Applications

The NIH Director's Pioneer Award (NDPA) is a daring new concept in the NIH funding portfolio that seeks to identify and fund exceptionally creative investigators to develop and test groundbreaking ideas that will make seminal contributions to biomedical science. The program received approximately 1300 nominations, from which about 250 nominees were selected as applicants. We are excited about the caliber of and creativity expressed in the nomination packages.

Nominees ranged across nearly all areas of the physical, behavioral and biomedical sciences. They included junior, mid-career and senior scientists, and they represented large, medium and small organizations in all parts of the country.

Applicants were notified in May 2004 and the application process will close on Monday, June 21, 2004 at 5PM, Eastern Daylight Time.
