D Prepare forces for near term operations

- Deploy and employ ready, relevant, and capable forces in support of the Global War on Terror.
- Provide OIF/OEF rotation forces with the required training, equipment, and capabilities.
- Incorporate OEF and OIF Lessons Learned during current operations in future investment decisions.

Improve future Warfighting capabilities

- Continue to constitute and set the force to meet Combatant Commander/Joint operational plans.
- Properly resource operational forces training and readiness as well as meeting depot maintenance requirements.
- Ensure the primacy of Sea Basing as the focused theme in further developing our Naval transformational capabilities.
- Advance Joint Sea Basing CONOPS and capabilities.
